

Beijing's most popular curriculums boiled down to their essence By Kipp Whittaker

> e know that picking a school is tough work. After all, quite possibly the entire future of your young learner is in the balance. With that said, we don't want to overwhelm you any more that you already are. So here's the key points of just about every curriculum you might encounter here in Beijing, boiled down to their essence to help you determine if it will be the right fit for your family. Keep in mind that no one curriculum reigns supreme, and there is plenty of variety within each of the approaches that is listed in this guide. So make sure to keep an open mind, and happy hunting!

## Reggio Emilia

Reggio Emilia is an innovative approach to early years education where children are seen as unique people who embark on a journey into the realms of research and exploration from the moment they are born, in order to find out about themselves, others, and the surrounding world.

- Acquiring knowledge and skills are considered natural human needs
- Students are active designers of their own development
- Asking questions is an essential tool for acquiring knowledge
- An environment where children are free to educate themselves is essential

## Multiple Intelligences

First conceived by Dr. Howard Gardner, Multiple Intelligences operates on the principle that that people learn and think differently, and there are numerous ways intelligences can manifest, ranging from linguistic, logical-mathematical, spatial, bodily-kinesthetic, musical, interpersonal, intrapersonal, and naturalist.

- Customized teaching methods
- Use of wide-ranging techniques to reach all students
- Children are taught to become selfconfident, to get along with others, and to be problem solvers
- Mainly found in kindergarten and elementary schools

## Montessori

Founded by Dr. Maria Montessori (1870-1952), the Montessori approach is founded on the belief that every child should be respected as an individual and allowed to learn at their own pace within the prepared environment of a classroom.

- Mixed-age classrooms
- Prepared physical and spiritual learning environment focused entirely on the child
- Making of individualized teaching and development plans
- Teachers are directors, supporters, and collaborators

## English National Curriculum

Launched in 1988 by the British government and used by all schools in England, Wales, Northern Ireland, and by thousands of British Curriculum schools all over the world. Students study the full breadth of subjects that are needed to help them develop into well-rounded citizens of the future.

- Highly structured and divided into six 'Key Stages'
- Ongoing development of the curriculum give the ENC high standing when compared to more linear ways of learning
- There are very few major cities where one of the 30,000 schools using the British curriculum model cannot be found.

## **International Baccalaureate**

IB World Schools are institutions accredited and authorized to offer either or all of the three programs: the Primary Years Programme or PYP (ages 3-12), the Middle Years Programme or MYP (ages 11-16), and the Diploma Programme or IBDP (ages 16-19).

- Has a 43-year history of high-quality international education
- One of the most popular and natural choices for expat families
- Requires study across a broad range of subjects
- IB diploma is accepted by over 2,000 universities in 75 countries

## Bilingual Approach

"Bilingual" isn't a curriculum in itself, but is an approach used by numerous schools to deliver instruction. Parents should note that for a native pronunciation, learning should ideally take place before age 7. While fluency can be achieved at any age, the feat becomes harder as a child or adult grows older and if motivation wanes at any point.

- Puts two languages in the part of the brain that considers a language as primary
- Uses both languages beyond studying grammar and topical vocabulary
- Languages can be split 50:50, 30:70, with co-teachers, split-days, or in rare cases, simultaneous teaching
- Top jobs around the world require bilingualism as a minimum requirement

#### UYBRID CURRICULUM

This curriculum can be described as the best of both worlds. It blends the Chinese education system (in the case of China-based schools) with internationally recognized styles such as the International Baccalaureate (IB), the English National Curriculum (ENC), American Common Core Standards, and the International Primary Curriculum (IPC).

- Ever-evolving and is offered from kindergarten to high school
- A curriculum that dives deeper into Chinese language and culture
- Graduates possess intellectual, cultural, and ecological fluency
- Found all over the world, however, each tailored to the respective local system



## **LEARNING ON THE WAY**

A brief history of international education in Beijing

very year since 2011, beijingkids has produced the School Choice Guide to provide comprehensive and up-to-date school information to our readers. During this time, there have been significant changes not only the sheer number of schools to choose from but also the climate of the quickly growing international education market in the capital. To present these developments clearly, we've crunched the numbers to share with you some of these developments along with a brief history of some of the most notable advancements throughout the decades.

FCD International School and the International Department of Beijing No. 55 Middle School are established to provide for the educational needs of a few foreign children in Beijing.

1970

The Beijing government allows 75 local public and private schools to teach foreign students. The Beijing Education Commission accredited these schools as such in 2003.

Private bilingual international schools including Beijing Huijia Private School (1993), AIDI School (1999), Beijing Royal School (2003), and Beijing New Talent Academy (2008) begin to spring up and fuse the gap between local and international curricula.

The embassies of the US, UK, Canada, Australia, and other countries establish International School of Beijing (ISB) to accommodate the increasing numbers of expat children in China.

**1980** 

After six years of hosting the Beijing International School Expo (BISE), beijingkids and our Chinese sister brand Jingkids, go "Beyond School Choice" and hold Jingkids International School Expo (JISE) at Kerry Hotel.

## THE NUMBERS SAY IT ALL

Tallying up our School Choice Guide data so that you don't have to

e accumulate ridiculous amounts of data when updating our annual School Choice G<mark>uide</mark> eve<mark>ry year</mark> and this process gives us keen insight into current trends going on in Beijing's international schools and also helps us to analyze what's on the horizon. While we don't intend for this to give you the willies when taking into account the current or rising tuition prices, we do hope it gives you some perspective on how you should be planning for the future and what you need to look out for when selecting a school for your child.

## AVERAGE 2019 SCHOOL TUITIONS

According to the International Schools Database, Beijing has the second-highest tuition costs out of a list of 40 international cities, second only to Shanghai. While we genuinely believe that Beijing is host to a number of top-notch schools, keep in mind that you don't always get what you pay for, so it essential to do your research. Also, alternatively, plenty of schools in the lower price bracket are very good.

#### PERCENT PRICE HIKE IN **TUITION PRICE**

We calculated this number from the 46 schools that have appeared in both the 2018 and 2019 School Choice Guides. And yes, we are as speechless as you are! Twelve percent is a significant increase in a single year. From our experience, one of the main expenses of international schools is finding and hiring the right teachers. While it would be interesting to find out how the teachers' salaries correspond to this increase, that figure is unfortunately beyond our reach.

#### STUDENTS PER CLASS...

...and there's one teacher for every six students. This is four students less than the average class size in the US (23 students). Also, the average student to teacher ratio in a US public school is currently at 16:1.

#### PERCENT OF SCHOOLS GIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

And that's a 15 percent drop from the number of schools that offer scholarships and financial assistance based on the 2018 School Choice Guide. With tuition prices on the rise each year, this is definitely an area of concern for many families currently residing or thinking about making the move to Beijing.

## WHAT I WISH I'D KNOWN... BEFORE CHOOSING A SCHOOL

Beijing parents share what they've learned about international education in the capital

s an old Chinese proverb puts it: "Reading ten thousand books is not as useful as traveling ten thousand miles." There's no teacher like experience, so we asked our friends on social media to tell us what their experience of the city's schools might teach others, when it comes to those all-important decisions about our children's education. This is what we learned.

#### Leadership

"How long has the current administration been in charge?"

"The head teacher whom we really liked was replaced with a less experienced head teacher who didn't inspire quite the same confidence." "Is it a profit or non-profit school?"

A school's leadership sets the tone for the whole institution, as well as deciding on the strategic direction. If you don't vibe with the principal or head teacher, then you may not feel at home in their school. It's worth too checking the school's management and ownership structure. A non-profit organization might have more resources to put back into facilities and staffing, but it's probably most important to reassure yourself the business is on a sound footing, and isn't at risk of closing unexpectedly.

#### Parent involvement

"How does the school communicate with the parents?

"A big deal is made of the parents' network and community support, and I can see why it inspires commitment."

How much you want to get involved with the life of your child's school depends on your availability and inclination. However you need to know how often you'll receive reports and meet your child's teachers, and who to talk to if there's a problem.

Many schools have active parent-teacher organizations, and these can enhance both the learning and the community spirit of a school, as well as providing purpose and friendship to newly-arrived parents. However, if a small clique dominates, this can become a cause of tension. And parents as fee-paying customers, can sometimes have too much say over educational matters which would be better left to the professionals (see Homework on page 12...)

#### Teaching staff

"How long have teachers been with the school (especially foreign teachers)? How long on average do teachers stay with the school?

"In one year, our child had three different teachers as each new recruit fled in alarm at the Beijing lifestyle they were expected to adopt. One begins to ask: Had they been properly recruited? Had they been properly prepared? Were they being paid enough?"

"One thing I found enlightening was to look at glassdoor.com to see how the teachers rate their working environment without the PR

'International Schools Review (internationalschoolsreview.com) is another good website for what staff think about their school."

A good teacher can have a positive impact, not just on a child's learning, but on their whole life. And unfortunately, an incompetent teacher can not only waste their students' valuable time, but also demotivate them. Many Beijing schools have extraordinarily impressive facilities, but in the end, it's the quality of the teaching staff which makes the most difference.

International schools will always have a higher staff turnover than local schools. This effect is exacerbated in Beijing, which is an exciting, vibrant city, but can be a challenging, even shocking environment to the unprepared. Stability is important for children, but on the other hand, longevity in staff is not necessarily a sign that they are the best teachers; they may be sticking around because they can't get work elsewhere, and are too well-entrenched to be "managed out".

It's well worth finding out about a school's recruitment and retention policies, but you should also visit the school, look at the work on display, speak to teachers if you can. And ask other parents what their experience has been. WeChat groups are a valuable resource for this.

#### **Facilities**

"If they have special rooms like a STEAM room\*, can you tour when they are actually having a class? (Some are there for show and kids never get to use them)."

Many of Beijing's international schools have facilities which would put some universities to shame. Sports stadiums, music studios, maker spaces, theaters, VR suites... the opportunities are extraordinary. But what matters to kids is what they learn from using those facilities. Sometimes schools get locked into an "arms race" where they're competing to build bigger and flashier facilities, and the educational purpose can get lost along the way. While you're being wowed on a school tour, make sure to find out what the students have done. Are the teachers being properly trained to use the spaces? Do the activities there form part of a coherent educational approach, or is it use for

STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics. It's an approach to teaching technical subjects in a creative way, currently hugely popular in global education.

#### Location

"We are living in Shuangjing and she takes the bus all the way to Shunyi... we considered moving, but in the end she likes to play with her friends on the bus."

Many of Beijing's international schools are located along a corridor leading out to the north-east Shunyi district. The location of Capital Airport, it has long been seen as an "expat-friendly" area, and has the space for schools to grow and sprawl. However if you're living in the central area, or (worse) out to the south or west, then the journey can uncomfortably extend an already long school day.

Some parents make the move to be nearer their child's school, but this can take you away from your own work and support networks. Of course, you may find, like the parent quoted above, that your kids enjoy the journey, or that you prefer life out in the 'burbs, with less traffic and cleaner air. Or you may find a downtown school that suits you. Whatever your situation, Beijing is a big city, and location is a factor you will need to take into consideration.

#### Orientation and transition

"What systems are in place for new students to adapt?"

"What flexibility is there in the school's educational approach to support those transitioning into and out of that system?"

If you're new to Beijing, you're probably struggling with some degree of culture shock. And the change can be much tougher for kids, who may have had little say in the decision to leave family, friends and the familiar behind. A proper program of orientation to help new students settle can be crucial to success

And even if your children are used to moving around, they might be faced with switching between different curricula and approaches. The move from Grade 6 in the US system to Year 7 in the British curriculum may not be a smooth one. The school should have plans in place to help not only students who are arriving but also those who are moving on.

#### Language

"The biggest factor is the approach to language. It is hard to teach, and a lot of work, for kids to really become fluent in both English and Chinese. Some schools try to be truly bilingual (or even trilingual), some focus on one language primarily, with the other either at a good foreign language standard or just assuming home or a tutor will do the rest."

Find out what languages are used for teaching. What standard is your child's second language? If you're new to Beijing, and they're only beginning in Chinese, you don't want them falling behind in other subjects because they don't understand the lesson. On the other hand, hearing two languages in the classroom can do wonders for their learning. And if they've been studying Chinese for a while, will they be put in a class with beginners?

#### Homework

"What is the school's policy on the amount of time that children spend on homework? Chinese government policy is no homework before Grade 3, so if they do give homework to younger kids ask why."

A respect for education is deeply embedded in thousands of years of Chinese culture, and this creates an environment where kids can excel academically. However, the flip side can be the belief that the more education you get the better, and this is not necessarily the case. To develop and flourish, children need to be intellectually challenged and stimulated, but they also need time to play, space to create unsupervised, and plenty of fresh air and sunshine.

The Chinese government is currently locked in a battle with this culture over the issue of homework. Academic research suggests there's little value in homework for younger children, and that work should take no longer than ten minutes per grade per night. Despite this, ambitious parents push for more and more homework, and educators give in, ignoring the various edicts issued by Beijing.

Don't get us wrong, appropriate homework can be a great tool to support learning, and independent study is essential for older children working towards exams and to complete coursework. But if younger children are spending a couple of hours a night on their homework, then it's worth asking what the purpose of it is.

#### Differentiation

"Do they accept any student or do they have a proper evaluation process? (If there's no evaluation process the classes can be very unbalanced.)'

"Do they stream the language levels and teach appropriately to the level of the student, or is it a 'one size fits all' approach?"

Different languages, different educational and cultural backgrounds, different expectations... if this is a challenge for the students, it's a nightmare for the teachers. Do they have the structures, skills, and support to make sure every child is learning at an appropriate level? Or do they stubbornly "teach to the middle", so that the more able are bored and the less able left behind?

#### Fees

"The one problem is the fees. Affording it is one thing; justifying it is another."

"Is my kid really worth USD 1-2 million in tuition over the next 12 years?"

The second parent quoted above was joking, obviously. Investing in our children's future is the most important financial investment we make. But all those top-class teachers and wonderful facilities don't come cheap. Beijing has the second highest school fees in the world, and if you're not lucky enough to work for a company which covers them, then what you can afford is likely to be a determining factor in which school you choose.

Many schools offer scholarships, or discounted rates for parents on lower incomes. It's always worth asking, and negotiating. But in a country where people often invest in their children instead of a pension fund, when they assess your spare income they're likely to ask you to dig deeper than you might find comfortable.

#### Community

"What is the language of the playground? How easy it is for new kids to break into friendship groups?"

The diversity of our daughter's classmates all but disappeared. She found herself one of only two or three foreign passport holders and native English speakers.

`The only foreign students are the teachers' children - and they are on literally all of the marketing materials for the school. It is misleading for sure.

"Any school which says it doesn't have a bullying problem, has a bullying problem."

If you've moved to another country with your family, you probably want your children to learn and study in an international environment, with the opportunity to make friends from different cultures and backgrounds. However, the reality is that there are more schools chasing a smaller pool of international students. Even schools that only accept foreign passport holders have an increasing proportion of students from a Chinese cultural and linguistic background. Some kids will thrive in this environment and learn quickly. Others may feel isolated.

Many schools have no effective bullying policy because they don't like to admit to prospective parents that such a thing might even take place. However, bullying is endemic in all large institutions, among adults as well as children, and pretending it can't happen in your school is tantamount to endorsing it. Find out what will happen if your child has a problem - and bear in mind, unpleasant as it may be, that your child may be among the bullies rather than the bullied.

#### Gut feeling

"What school is good for you is so dependent on your circumstances."

"Research the facts, visit the school fairs, visit the school, then take your chances."

All kids are different. And all schools are different. The problem with academic league tables is that average grades conceal the students who excelled, and the students who struggled. In researching this article we talked to parents who had problems leading to them moving their child out of one school, while other parents praised that same school to the skies.

In the end, there is no "best school in Beijing". There's just the best school for your child, for you as a family. And the way to find it is probably to whittle your choices down to a shortlist, then visit those schools. If you like a place at an open house, see if you can visit on an ordinary day, to get past the marketing gloss to the real spirit of the place. Trust your instincts. Nobody knows your child like you do... and nobody else can tell you what's best for them.



# REVOLUTIONIZING SCHOOL FOOD

Food health and safety in schools

lerrible school lunches are have always been a source of jokes for kids. But for parents who are increasingly concerned about food hygiene and the impact of nutrition on learning and intelligence, what the cafeteria serves up is no longer a laughing matter. Along with questions about curriculum and facilities, parents are asking schools about the meals they provide: what ingredients are being used, how those ingredients are sourced, and what variety is on offer. And of course, about the biggest concern of all: food safety and hygiene.

Nutrition and learning go hand in hand, and this should shape the way in which school dinners are designed. A growing body of research evidences not only how timing of meals and sleep influences learning but also how what our kids eat can either negatively or positively impact their cognitive development and abilities when in the classroom. Chef Ann Cooper, Director of Nutrition Services for the Berkeley Unified School District in the United States, has spoken about revolutionizing the way kids eat at school. Local, sustainable, seasonal, and even educational food, she believes, is the way ahead for school dinners and better learning, "Each of us sends our kids or grandchildren, nieces or nephews to school and tells them to learn," she said in a 2007 TED talk. "And when you feed kids bad food, that's really what they're learning."

In a recent study published in the open-access journal PLoS Biology, Rudolph Nager, Pat Monaghan, and Michael Fisher investigated the connection between poor nutrition in early life, compensatory growth, and learning ability in adulthood, and found that inadequate nutrition for young children can impair their neural development, leading to lower IQ.

To find out more about what can be achieved in transforming school meals, beijingkids spoke to Richard Craggs, entrepreneur and CEO of Nom Nom, about how he has helped to revolutionize school dinners in Shenzhen, and what questions parents should be keen to ask schools about food quality, nutrition, and hygiene in their canteens.

Craggs moved to China 12 years ago, and spent his life savings on building a socially responsible business that would help improve the quality of canteen food in factories and schools. Starting off with two small lossmaking restaurants, Craggs now owns the leading service provider of design-led and innovative cafeterias for international schools in the South of China. His philosophy is driven, not only by the voices of schools but by the parents and students themselves. "Listening and blending this into our expertise has helped design our recipe-managed menus that are constantly evolving," he said.

The school menu design process for Craggs and his team always starts with the customers

first: the parents and the kids. Parents are an important aspect of how they go about achieving eclectic and ever-evolving menus for their clients. Some parents have even been invited to share their home recipes with professional chefs in order to create meals that are already much loved and familiar with students. "Some of the best meals come from homes," Craggs explained. "We always welcome new ideas. Our menus constantly rotate to prevent menu fatigue and evolve."

Nom Nom's menu design is also heavily reliant on an extended collaborative effort; one that includes customer feedback, nutritionists, and dieticians to formulate monthly meal plans. "It's important to ensure ongoing recipe management to offer consistent new menu items, as well as our chef sharing ideas between all our kitchens," Craggs said. This "boutique" approach is truly a bespoke way of approaching school dinners, and even among the biggest players such as Compass, Spexo, and Aramark, Nom Nom has created their own practices that differ from any other.

"We listen to the customer, be it the school, the parents, or the children, and customize a tailored solution... We never send out generic tenders or presentations, each one is meticulously detailed," Craggs said.

Parents wanting to know more about how

caterers operate within schools may wish to ask if their choice of school for their kids has followed the same stringent procurement processes as the ones on Craggs's clientele list. Schools that are looking into catering options should be asking for proposals that cover areas such as food safety, hygiene, menus, and supply chains, among others. Is your child's school conducting onsite visits with their chosen caterers? Are they sampling the food that ends up on your kids' dinner plate? Are they ensuring that references are obtained to acquire a full and impartial opinion about the abilities, and standards of their prospective or existing school caterers?

With a number of food scandals having taken place in China in recent years, Craggs's philosophy on school catering, and more, is an inspiration and requires that we as parents deeply reflect on how food can and should be more than just sustenance, but a way to "upgrade the lives of people." Craggs believes wholeheartedly in what he does and sets exceptionally high standards. "I would say it's all of our responsibility as caterers to work tirelessly to raise the current standards," he said. "Food safety is paramount within our philosophy, in addition to hygiene, taste, fresh scratch-made meals, excitement, innovation, safe ingredient sourcing, and more.





Food safety should be standard and without compromise."

Cragg detailed the rigorous process he employs, concerning how ingredients are sourced. "We have a stringent supplier approval process and as CEO, I personally meet with every supplier and travel back up their supply chain to the farms to inspect the land, the government-approved licenses, testing certificates, and ingredients, with the support of our supply chain and quality teams. It's this level of detail that consumers deserve."

Nom Nom currently only operates in the south of China, but Craggs hopes to bring their services to Beijing schools soon.

"We have been fortunate to have been approached by international schools, parents, offices, and factories in Beijing," he said. "However we have a holistic catering approach that involves cooking onsite, central kitchens, and food tech, as all three pieces combined justifies the investment and supports the cost structure of our other secret sauce departments. We will migrate once our model is complete in the South during the course of 2019."

Craggs has been inspired by Britain's celebrity chef turned school dinners activist Jamie Oliver, and continues to be a huge fan. Oliver's Feed Me Better campaign in 2005 garnered much praise and a mass following for his call to revamp and improve school dinners throughout the UK. He even managed to convince the British government to create the Children's Food Trust. "I'm a huge fan of Jamie Oliver, his books, his shows, his war on sugar (even though I'm now paying more for a Kit Kat!)" Craggs said. "And of course his food revolution within UK schools. This in part, inspired me to work to upgrade food services within schools in China."

Craggs has now himself become a source of inspiration, and "disrupting" an industry, he says, should be the goal for all modern-day entrepreneurs. "One piece of advice I would give to any aspiring entrepreneur is to be brave and fearless, as sometimes the world needs a determined and fresh set of eyes," he told us.

So how can school caterers do better?

"Training and retraining with regards to food safety and hygiene, as well as regular random inspections from management, are key for success," said Craggs. "China has experienced a number of food safety scandals, and most are greed driven, so we wish to support the Chinese government's food safety policies. and together drive a change for good."

Remember: if you don't ask, you don't get! Parents should be encouraged to understand the details of the catering process at their child's school, from the supply chain to food safety, and to give their feedback.

As parents, we can very much be a part of the food revolution taking place in schools in China, just by asking the right questions. Get involved, and see if you can petition your kids' school to involve you and your children in some of the decision making concerning their school dinners. Ask about their catering process, supply, hygiene, and nutrition. Be proactive in ensuring that nothing but the

very best is being served in your kids' school canteens. Craggs reminded us that we are lucky to be in China, where the diet is healthier than the one we might be used to in the West. "However, we do secretly blend vegetables into some of our sauces," he said. "Just don't tell the kids!"

## **How Should Parents Approach Schools?**

- Suggest school dinner taster sessions during open days
- Ask for details about which external companies are being used to supply your kids' school dinners
- Offer up ideas to improve student health and education, such as studentled and cultivated vegetable gardens on school premises, (or initiate your own)
- · Find out what regional/local ingredients are being used in your kids' school meals, or ask what regional items can be added
- Offer healthy family favorite recipes to your kids' school kitchen, and ask to speak to the school's head chef about the nutritional value of their meals
- · Ask to see a school's kitchen and cooking facilities

# DOING IT UIFFEKENILY Homeschooling in Beijing

ost people regard their child's education as a major priority. Parents often make huge sacrifices and willingly expend time, effort, and finances to ensure that their children receive the best possible education. And not without good reason, as generally speaking, the type of education one receives often determines how well they do in life. But what exactly constitutes a good education? Is homeschooling a viable option for expat parents in Beijing? Can this mode of education effectively prepare children to succeed in today's society?

We asked three expats with homeschooling experience to help shed light on these fundamental questions.



## THERESE BARON

Therese and her husband have lived in China since 2006. The couple have four children aged 6, 7, 9, and 11, all of whom were born in Beijing. Therese is currently in her fifth year of homeschooling.

## What do you like about homeschool-

I like being able to work with my kids all day long. Each child learns at a different pace. They can be really fast in one subject and really slow in another. I can allow them to do that because we make our own schedule and it's tailored to each child.

#### What's challenging about homeschooling?

The higher the grade, the more I have to figure out how to make sure they are getting everything. With higher level math, if you can't do it you have to find someone who can teach them or an online program.

#### Are there any challenges with homeschooling that are unique to living in Beijing?

The lack of libraries and all the activities that are usually connected to a library is a challenge here. We overcome this challenge by downloading books for the kids to read on their Kindle. We also make use of reading app subscriptions, and the kids love to listen to audiobooks.

#### How do you develop your children's social skills?

We want people to enjoy being around our children. So we are always encouraging them to think about how they can be friendly: things like, if they see a kid being left out of something, try to include them. We have four children so they have plenty of practice with each other. If I was parenting an only child, I would have to do more to help that along.

#### What advice would you give to someone who's thinking about homeschooling?

It has to be understood that homeschooling is a commitment. It's true that it is flexible. I like that we can do double school one day, and take a family day the next. But if you're too flexible and you can't stay on a schedule, it's easy to derail your child's education. Also, it's really helpful to have a friend who's homeschooling as well: someone who can encourage you on the days you feel like giving up, somebody you can bounce ideas off. It doesn't always have to be someone here, but it is good to have someone to talk to.

## ANDRFA VIFRA

Andrea and her family moved to Beijing in 2013. Andrea has four children aged 6, 17, 19, and 21. Her two oldest children are currently in college in the US. Andrea began homeschooling in America, and her homeschooling experience spans 17 years.

#### What do you like about homeschoolina?

In the early years, homeschooling really suited our lifestyle. We were a military family and so we moved every three or four years. Homeschooling was the thing that made our life predictable. No matter what was going on, we just did homeschool. It was something that pulled our life together.

#### What aspects of homeschooling do you find challenging?

When I started homeschooling, many of the resources that are available now were just developing. So there was often that question of, "Am I doing the right thing?" Most people who send their kids to school don't really think about this. They just send their kids to school because that's what people do. They don't overanalyze everything.

#### What advice would you give to someone who is thinking about homeschooling?

I think it's important for people intending to homeschool to develop some sort of philosophy and revisit it every few years. Ideally, this exercise will provide an answer to two questions: "Why are we doing this? and "What is the goal?"

#### What is the goal of homeschooling for your family?

In the US and here, there is a huge focus on college. That was never our main intention. We always expected our children to go to college and talked to them about college so that it seemed normal, but my goal was so much bigger. I wanted each of my children to develop into a whole person who succeeds in life, not just gets into college. I want to see who my children become after college. For me, going to college is just one part of life, not all of life.

It was also really important to us that we taught our children how to learn independently so they didn't always have to be taught things. In traditional forms of education, you are taught things by a teacher, you memorize those things and then you take a test. Well, you should be learning your entire life. After college there isn't a test on everything you learn. We wanted to foster a lifelong desire to continue learning.

#### What curriculum do you use and how did vou choose it?

We started off with a curriculum called Sonlight because it came all together and ready to go. As the years passed our curriculum became an amalgamation of pieces from several different curriculums. We also used online classes and online community college. In terms of choosing a homeschool curriculum, I would really recommend just picking something and starting. After a year of doing it, it will be easy to see what you love and what is the thing that everyone hates everyday. Then you can go and talk to friends and ask, "What do you use for this?" It's helpful to talk to different people about the way they homeschool because there are so many ways to do it.


#### How do you ensure your children receive adequate socialization?

It depends on your definition of socialization. This whole concept of socialization often refers to interacting with people who were born the same year as you. My children can interact with people of other ages easily and they've always been like that. I don't think we did anything magical; we just exposed them to a whole range of other people. In life you have to interact with people who are all different ages. My kids were always doing music and sport. They kind of had both worlds. If you just stay home all day, every day, then your child is going to be that stereotypical socially awkward kid, but it's not because they were homeschooled; it's because they weren't socialized properly.

#### Does a person need teaching experience in order to homeschool well?

In reality, you are your child's first teacher. You taught your child to walk and to talk. If you can read, you can teach your child to do it. You grow with them and your teaching style develops with them. Teaching your child at home is very different from standing at the front of a classroom having to deal with classroom management. When I started homeschooling, I had to change the images that I had of "school" and develop new ones.

Lisa and her family took up residence in China way back in 1988. Lisa has been homeschooling in Beijing for 22 years. She has three adult children and is currently homeschooling her last child, a 17-year-old high schooler.

#### When the time came to apply for college and then actually go to college, were your children at a disadvantage due to having been homeschooled?

For the colleges we applied for, it wasn't at all a problem that they had been homeschooled. Once they got to college, academically they were fine. In some cases, they were actually at an advantage. They struggled in other areas, such as being tied to somebody else's timetable, but academics weren't a problem.

I would say that parents need to help their kids figure out what they want early on. If they want to go to Harvard or Yale they need to be thinking about that as early as Grade 9, so that they can design their homeschool program accordingly.

#### How do you ensure your children receive adequate socialization?

My children didn't lack in this area! They had too much socialization. They went to a homeschool co-op, they attended youth groups, and they played community soccer. They also had a lot of friends in our apartment complex. This city has a good transport system so it is easy for youngsters to get around by themselves.

#### What is a homeschool co-op?

Co-ops provide children with an opportu-

nity to participate in activities such as music groups, science experiments, and art workshops. Some of them also organize an annual graduation ceremony.

#### What tips do you have on choosing a homeschool curriculum?

I would recommend starting with something that is all there in one package. Begin to understand how your child learns and then you can slowly veer away from the package if you need to. Over time you'll get comfortable with branching out. And remember, it's not really about stuffing them full of information. We are trying to give our children the tools that they need for learning because today's information will be outdated tomorrow.

#### What advice would you give to parents thinking about homeschooling?

It's important to be connected with other people who are doing the same thing as you.

#### And how does one go about getting connected with these people?

You could try posting on internet chat groups, or any one of the many familyorientated WeChat groups. You could also try approaching the international schools that homeschooling families might be connected to, such as the schools that homeschooled students might go to take their SATs.

Homeschooling families can be found across the city, with children ranging from preschool to high school age. For the parent wishing to embark upon the adventure of homeschooling, or for the seasoned homeschooler wishing to build up a network of Beijingbased comrades, it is well worth taking the time to track down these homeschooling parents. You can do this by asking around — both in person and online via the plethora of social network platforms that we have at our disposal. You'll find that homeschooling parents are often extremely generous with their time and very willing to share their expertise with those just starting out.

# VLADIMIR DEMENTYEV "The school not only considers marks, but more your personal efforts for improvement."

learning and improving.

Dementyev was born and grew up in Beijing, : and joined YCIS Beijing two years ago on a full scholarship. Introducing himself as someone very into mathematics, Dementyev later surprised us with his skill at dancing. He has taken part in many competitions in and out of China, and has won over 50 awards.

Dementyev told us why he and his parents agreed on YCIS Beijing in the first place.

"When I visited YCIS at one of their open house days, I felt very at home here—welcoming environment and friendly staff. And what I really like about YCIS is the diversified courses I can choose from."

Having been informed about the scholarship program, Dementyev's mom emailed the school admission office for more details. The school replied with the application form, which, Dementyev told us, is nine pages long.

"I was travelling in Yunnan with my friends, and the schedule was tight: one week. So I set that as my priority and imposed myself to . finish the application during the night when : the principal, which took about 40 minutes, everyone else was hanging out. And I was away from my parents, so there was not really any extra help at hand."

The questions are not about general knowledge, but about your life; for example, 'Who is the person that has had the most influence on your life?' I find questions like this quite difficult to deal with. The very first thing to pop up in my mind was my grandfather, and I probably could have written an essay of over 10,000 words, but the application form only allows space for around 200 words. Stuff like this posts unique challenges to me. Fortunately, I succeeded getting into the second round interview."

"The interview was online since I was out of Beijing, and was with department heads and a group of teachers. It went pretty smoothly. They asked me questions like why I chose YCIS, and my hobbies, stuff like that."

"I had a final face-to-face interview with

and also I was asked to take an English test."

The most valuable is a full scholarship usually awarded by the school's admissions team. We spoke to two students who were successful in applying for full scholarships: Year 10 student Vladimir Dementyev and Year 9 student Francesco Babs, both studying at Yew Chung International School of Beijing (YCIS Beijing).

> Dementyev was offered a full scholarship, but that's not the end of the story. The scholarship lasts for one year, after which recipient's achievements and performance at the beginning of the new school year, to decide whether to renew it or not. This acts as a stimulus to Dementyev to keep improving.

> Asked to give suggestions for potential YCIS Beijing scholarship applicants, Dementyev says: "The school not only considers marks, but more your personal efforts for improvement. My English level was quite laid back which has me worried. But my teachers really helped with that. Also, show the school the advantages you have compared to other candidates. If you have a special talent, let them know, because that definitely acts as the icing on the cake."



# Francesco Babs "Be confident, and keep improving"

Babs is from a third culture family—his mom is Italian and dad Nigerian. He moved to Beijing with his family ten years ago and joined YCIS Beijing last year, also on a full scholarship.

When talking about his experience, Babs is frank about the advantage that his third-culture family background gave him.

"I decided to give it a shot when I learned about YCIS's scholarship offering, but I wasn't very optimistic about it to be honest, because I was worried that my academic record wouldn't stand out."

"Yet to my surprise, the application weighs quite a lot on more personal stuff like my background growing up, my hobbies, and so on. This was good because it made me realize how much positive influence I've received from my parents. The way my parents exerted themselves to get where they are today, and their support and encouragement to me to freely develop my personal interests like soccer and chess, are what affects me most."

The application form is only the first step on the long road to the scholarship. The subsequent interviews with the principals and administrators were more challenging

"All the interview questions were very open and required real thought. I paused several times trying to figure out how to adequately express myself. I think the interview really helped me in some ways, to be prepared for other interviews in the future."

Babs sees being on a full scholarship as a doubleedged sword. From his personal perspective, YCIS Beijing has a quite different system from his former school. "It encourages us to build critical thinking and self-regulation, and they appreciate a global perspective."

"The scholarship is certainly encouraging, yet adds extra pressure at the same time. It reminds you all the time that you need to work harder than your counterparts to feel deserving of it, and to guarantee yourself having it the following school year. It's a lot of pressure, but affected my learning in a very positive way. I think this is probably also one of the main reasons why our school provides scholarships—to encourage students to keep motivated and improving."

As for advice to applicants, Babs says the main thing is to be yourself.

"Be confident, don't be too modest, don't be shy and say all the things that you do. Also, be honest. Because they're going to check and ask you in the next round. The most important part they care about is our growth, what the teacher thinks you're going to do in the future. "

# EDUCATION FOR ALL

We talk to special education professionals in Beijing, to find out more about learning support networks and China's attitudes to disability and inclusion

he discussion about disabilities and special needs in China has come a long way in recent years, despite the reticence brought about by traditional attitudes on both the familial and the societal level. In a move which could be seen as a step forward for people with disabilities (PWDs), the State Council of China designated August 25 as "Disability Awareness and Prevention Day," in response to a request from the China Disabled Persons Foundation (CDPF).

As many as 85 million Chinese people live with some form of disability, at least according to a national census carried out in 2010. The same data revealed that almost half of Chinese PWDs (46 percent) at that time were illiterate due to poverty, social discrimination, or the lack of barrier-free facilities and teaching staff prepared for students with special needs.

The government's National Action Plan on Disability Prevention (2016-2020) mentions prevention and control of disability in two different contexts: the first, and perhaps the polarizing one, focuses on birth defects, as about 900,000 babies are born with congenital disorders every year. The other focus is the improvement of environments to prevent or reduce the risk of injuries or diseases (infectious, endemic, chronic, and mental) which may cause temporary or permanent debilitation.

On the sidelines of that national plan came China's move to revise the regulations on the education of PWDs, which promotes integrated education and opens up mainstream schools to students with special needs, as well as mandating local governments to allocate funding and resources for the education of PWDs.

The New York-based non-government group Human Rights Watch, however, says that while those new regulations have been influenced by international standards, they still fall short in critical areas as "China still imposes discriminatory obstacles for children with disabilities to be placed in mainstream schools."

Grace Zhang, the managing editor of our sister brand Jingkids, experienced that in 2015 when her then three-and-a-half-year-old son was "misdiagnosed" as having Asperger syndrome.

"My son dropped out of kindergarten because of violence. The principal suggested that we visit a doctor to see if my child is autistic. Later, a specialist did not diagnose autism but said my son had behavioral problems, so he referred us to an institution for behavioral training. He made some progress after a year of training so we decided to let him return to an integrated school environment," she told us.

For Zhang, finding a suitable school proves to be an obstacle for many Chinese families with children with special needs because "if you tell the admissions people directly that the child has a problem, chances are that they will not accept the child for various reasons." She, however, managed to enroll him into a kindergarten with fewer than ten students. But for elementary school, she says it's another "obstacle."

"Although the national policy stipulates that schools cannot refuse to enroll their children, the problem is that there are a large number of public primary schools in the country and enforcing the policy is just difficult. Teachers will also hate such children with behavioral problems, and there are too few special education facilities available."

In the context of international education in Beijing, many institutions offer learning support services and at the same time, there's an active community of special educational needs (SEN) educators and professionals in the city. Such a group is the Special Education Network in Beijing (SENIB) founded in 2009. We caught up with one of SENIB founders, Dr. Reed Rhodes, who is also an Early Childhood Center Student Support Teacher at Beijing City International School (BCIS).

#### What can you tell about progress in the discussion about special needs/education in Beijing?

Dr. Rhodes: The size of SEN programs within schools has grown and there has been a gradual merging of learning support (LS) and English language learning. Tanya Farrol and I founded SENIB in 2009 for SEN professionals to share resources and support each other within the context of Beijing. The current SENIB membership is currently over 200 professionals and people from the community, and has almost doubled in the past five years. SENIB is the first local chapter of Special Education Network in Asia (SENIA), an association of educators, professionals, and parents whose mission is to advocate for and provide resources/supports for differently abled individuals.

Here are some of the trends that we have seen in Beijing since the establishment of SENTB:

- There's an increase in the number of external expertise providers and there has been a move to offer a variety of services at multidisciplinary centers specifically catering to SEN needs.
- The number of shadow teachers in schools has also increased.
- There's an improvement in the provision of professional development about SEN provided by international schools and delivered to local Chinese schools.

What should parents whose children may have special needs or been diagnosed with a learning disability expect in terms of special education in Beijing?

Dr. Rhodes: Although there is currently a dearth of educational placements for children with severe SEN (there is only one classroom for these children in Beijing), we at SENIB see a trend that most schools now employ LS teachers and counselors while a few have specialists like speech and language therapists and psychologists. Parents can contact schools directly to see what programs are offered.

Special needs is still a tricky topic, especially at the family level. What advice can you give to parents/ families that feel burdened or reiected because of a special needs member?

Dr. Rhodes: At the very minimum, families can access help from an external expertise provider, especially at multidisciplinary centers that offer an array of specialists. But if they are at a loss, we have our WeChat and Facebook groups where families can meet like-minded people and specialists who can provide support. We also invite parents to our seasonal activities like a Resource Fair and general meetings of special needs educators held at different international schools in the city.



#### How do special needs educators in Beijing integrate 21st Century education into their SN programs?

Dr. Rhodes: The use of social media connects SEN providers who share information and resources and actually, many SENIB members in Beijing work at schools who are members of Next Frontier Inclusion (NFI), an organization that represents cutting-edge information for international educators in the field of SEN. NFI promotes and protects the interests of children who learn in different ways or at different rates by supporting schools in all aspects of their journey towards inclusion. During the school year, professionals from NFI regularly present workshops all over the world, including the yearly SENIA (Special Education Network in Asia) conference, as well as conducting special programs during the summer.

# MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR SCHOOL VISIT

arge fairs such as the Jingkids International School Expo (JISE) give parents a chance to meet prospective schools as well as a wide insight into the trends in the international education scene in Beijing. Once you locked in your focus on several school prospects, the real challenge comes in.

Finding the right school may be an arduous task for parents but it can help them understand what's in store for their children's future, considering the lengths many of these educational institutions go to offer the "best" out there.

A sensible way to examine schools is to join their open house events, which may happen once a month or several times a quarter. Take advantage of these primers but do your homework to get beyond the glossy presentations and rehearsed tours.

The general idea whenever you join these events is to: Stop to meet the school staff and student body. Look at your checklist and observe the school environment. Listen to the speech of the presenting staff.

# **OPEN HOUSE GUIDE**



### Meet the members of the school community

Open days typically begin with tour of the new or state-of-theart facilities, followed by a presentation from the headmaster or head teacher, and finally a question-and-answer session. You don't have to wait until the last part to meet the school community. Say hi to young students, greet school staff, and look at the action in the classrooms. 2



### Take a deeper look at teachers

Observe how teachers present themselves and work with students because they have the most day-to-day interactions with your kid(s). You can also ask the presenter about the teachers' achievements and retention, as well as recruitment and vacancies because these may give an insight into the stability of the teaching staff.

### Go to the usual areas

New school buildings, state-of-the-art laboratories, cozy libraries – yes, open day hosts will be ready to spotlight these facilities at length, but your open day itinerary should also include a visit to the spaces kids regularly go to. Pupils' toilets are great areas to inspect and see the school's values, especially toward health and cleanliness.

### Listen to presenters...

School introductions may appear smart and enticing, but let's face it: these are all sales pitch and marketing strategies. Listen thoroughly to what the hosts say about their achievements or progress, and the way they talk. These points can help you gauge the personality of the people leading the school as well as ascertain whether their approach is geared towards the future of your child or of the school.

### ...And quiz them

Make good use of question times or open forums by not asking the headmaster or head teachers the obvious. Direct your queries to what their strategies are to ensure that kids learn well, as well as what their specific intervention methods are for kids who are underachieving. Ask them about the alumni body and where they have gone after their stay at the school.

### Go along with your kid(s)

They'll be the ones to spend time at the school, so it's important to gauge their reaction to the prospective environment – from the facilities down to the teachers and schoolmates. Give them moments to look around and meet other children and once you get home, ask them how they felt during the visit.
