

very year, when putting together the School Choice Guide, we are inundated with vast amounts of data: everything from tuition prices to number of students and class sizes to accreditation. And given the fact that we are, doubtlessly, the preeminent voice on all things international education in Beijing, we understand that it's our duty to crunch these numbers so that you don't have to. After all, you've got much bigger things to worry about – namely, identifying the best school for your child! So sit back and relax. Well, at least until you see some of these figures.

Note: This data reflects information gathered from the 58 schools profiled in this year's School Choice Guide. As schools provide data in various ways, these statistics should be regarded as a general primer, and not a scientific analysis.

AVERAGE TUITION PRICES

This one may be the most important to our readers due to the fact that it can literally dictate whether or not your child will attend a certain school. Interestingly enough, according to our data, the most expensive grades to get your student through will be their elementary years. While an expensive tuition doesn't necessarily mean the best education for your child's unique needs and learning style, it is worth noting that these will be some of the most formative years in your child's development, and could decide their trajectory for years to come. Cost given is per year.

AVERAGE CLASS SIZE

This number has actually remained unchanged since last year, as has its correlating six to one student - teacher ratio. It's welcome news given that back in the 1980s, Brookings Institute conducted a study, one of the most credible to date, which found that students in classes with between 15 and 22 pupils and lower student - teacher ratios were three months ahead in their learning than students in larger classrooms. So while tuition price isn't a definitive indicator of a school's worth, the ability of teachers to provide each child with individualized attention and support certainly is.



Comparatively, 2017's School Choice Guide had 55 percent of schools offering scholarship opportunities, and that number dropped to 40 percent in 2018, so things are looking up. BEIJING GURRICULUM GUIDE

Curricula at a glance

he days of a teacher standing in the front of a classroom throwing words at students and hoping something sticks is long gone. Education has undergone an incredible transformation of unparalleled diversity and complexity. With so many schools teaching a multitude of curriculum types, it can be easy to get lost in what each school has to offer in the terms of teaching ap-

proach and student learning. To get a better understanding of the different curricula out there, we interviewed seven schools that have all adopted a specific curriculum to teach their student body. Please keep in mind that this guide is not meant to suggest which curriculum is the best, but to simply give a better understanding of how they differ from one another and how some of Beijing's schools implement them.

Hybrid Curriculum

A hybrid curriculum is just as its name suggests. Two curricula are selected by the school, one being an international curriculum such as IB or Common Core using English as its main language for instruction, and the other being the national curriculum of the country the school is in. Therefore, schools have much greater flexibility in the courses they can provide for students as well as making the transition into enrolling in the school easier for students who are coming in from public schools. Core subjects from the Chinese National Curriculum are taught, but the teaching approach may be more Western as hands-on activities such as presentations, debates, and team-oriented research are incorporated.

How Hybrid Curriculum works at BSB Shunyi:

Students at the British School of Beijing, Shunyi (BSB Shunyi) follow an enhanced English National Curriculum completing the IGCSE examinations at age 16. Then senior students aged 17 and 18 study for the IB Diploma. Their German Primary Programme for native Germans includes the Thuringia Curriculum core subjects in German and integrates into the English Curriculum for the other subjects with their peers.

International Baccalarveate

IB programs are designed to have students think critically and challenge one another as they are encouraged to become independent global citizens. There are four main programs offered to students: The IB Diploma Program and the IB Career-related Program (ages 16-19), the Middle Years Program (ages 11-16), and the Primary Years Program (ages 3-12). IB schools have been authorized and accredited to teach these programs by the International Baccalaureate.

How International Baccalaureate works at BCIS:

Beijing City International School (BCIS) employs a play-based approach to early childhood learning, an inquiry-based approach in their Elementary School, and an impact-based approach to the Secondary School learning. The three approaches to the IB programs enable students of all ages to guide their learning and apply it in meaningful ways. For their oldest students, the Secondary School Learning Model develops the four key impacts of critical thinking, creative thinking, purposeful doing, and connected learning to best equip these students to meet personal goals in their future education and lives beyond.

Bilingual Approach

While not officially a curriculum, it is still an approach to learning that has been adopted and applied by many schools. Its focus is on having two languages taught with the goal of both languages being considered as primary languages for the learner. This approach is highly recommended to take place for learners before they turn 7, in order for them to have a more manageable time reaching fluency.

How Bilingual Approach works at BIBA

The Bilingual Approach to education at Beijing International Bilingual Academy (BIBA) is ultimately about making connections, facilitating communication, and expanding horizons by providing opportunities for students to learn two languages simultaneously.

Multiple Intelligences

Multiple Intelligences was developed in 1983 by Dr. Howard Gardner, professor of education of Harvard University. It is a competency based curriculum mainly for kindergarten and elementary schools. There are numerous ways intelligences can manifest, ranging from linguistic, logical-mathematical, spatial, bodily-kinesthetic, musical, interpersonal, intrapersonal, and naturalist.

How Multiple Intelligences works at Ivy School

Designed around a six-week inquiry cycle, the curriculum explores six theme units over the course of a school year. Working with teachers, children participate in activities that seek to help them to explore and answer focus questions that allow them to develop a deeper understanding of their world. Ample time is set aside for play as it is the most important "work" of children. Not only do Ivy kids learn the knowledge and skills that they will require for first grade, but also thinking routines and learning habits such as planning and reflection that will serve them throughout their lives.

REGGIO EMILIA

Reggio Emilia is a student-centered and experiential learning approach that is based on the principles of respect, responsibility, and community through exploration and discovery, creating a self-guided curriculum. The aim of the Reggio approach is to help children reach their full academic and social potential.

How Reggio Emilia works at House of Knowledge

House of Knowledge (HoK) was the first school in Beijing to adopt the Reggio Emilia approach to learning. In the pursuit of creating a rigorous elementary curriculum for internationally minded students, HoK elementary school adopted the highly regarded International Primary Curriculum (IPC), which is a comprehensive thematic curriculum with emphasis placed on meeting students at their academic and developmental level.

English National Curriculum

The English National Curriculum was launched in 1988 by the UK government and used by all state schools in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland. Under the English Curriculum, students study the full breadth of subjects divided into blocks of years known as "Key Stages" (KS). These Key Stages are designated into 4 different stages which go from KS1 to KS4, and the curriculum is constantly undergoing developments which gives it a high standing compared to more linear ways of learning.

How the English National Curriculum works at Harrow Beijing:


Since the establishment of Harrow Beijing in 2005, they have developed their own curriculum which takes the best of the English National Curriculum and also incorporates elements of the Chinese curriculum. Their chosen curriculum at the Senior School and Sixth Form is IGCSE and A-Level, which require students to think and not just regurgitate facts, to develop independent, investigative styles of learning. It seamlessly flows from Early Years Foundation (2 years old) right through to Y13 (18 years old).

Montessori

Founded on the belief that every child should be respected as an individual and allowed to learn at their own pace within the prepared environment of a classroom, the Montessori approach provides children with mixed-age classrooms by stages rather than grades, and makes individualized teaching and development plans. Teachers are directors, supporters, and collaborators.

How Montessori works at MSB:


The teachers at International Montessori School of Beijing (MSB) are constantly observing, assessing and planning lessons to meet the needs of the children. Studies are integrated not only in terms of subject matter but in terms of moral learning as well, resulting in an appreciation and respect for life. Elementary-aged children are in a world of the abstract, and the instruction given to them must appeal to the imagination.



THE SUMMER SQ

How to maximize your vacation time, without forsaking your vacation

While this all sounds well and good, the honest truth is that for many of us, knowing you have three months of unfettered, uninterrupted "you time" is a one-way ticket to Procrastination Town. As each day melts into the next like ice cream on hot asphalt, "I'll do it tomorrow" becomes the mantra of the month, and before you know it, three months have slipped by and the

sun is setting on your final summer evening.

If that wasn't bad enough, not only did you miss out on a chance to learn a new skill or create that website for your budding business, you've also fallen victim to the "Summer Slide", a phenomenon in which students lose roughly 25 percent to 30 percent of the knowledge they accrued the previous school year. As Gary Huggins, CEO of US-based National Summer Learning Association told Huffington Post, "summer is a great break from school, but not a great break from learning."

Here at beijingkids, we couldn't agree more. And while we understand the importance of honoring your summer with some serious fun in the sun, we also know that it's an incredible opportunity to grow. As such, we've compiled a few helpful tips to ensure that as the weather heats up, so too does your productivity.



Lowering the Visual Volume

The school year is a hectic time filled with textbooks, papers, and notes, not to mention projects stopped and started, reworked and revised, and ultimately buried deep in the doldrums of your desk drawers. Chances are, over the past nine months, your workspaces at home, both digital and physical, have turned into a veritable war zone, the remnants of your heroic battle with the forces of scholarly pursuits, a battle you no doubt conquered.

As it happens though, this clutter can significantly impair your ability to get things done. In fact, according to a study conducted in 2011 at Princeton University, and cited by Ralph Ryback MD in Psychology Today, "the visual cortex can be overwhelmed by task-irrelevant objects, making it harder to allocate attention and complete tasks efficiently." That means if you're ever going to have a major breakthrough in that project you've been dreaming up, you're going to want a clean, fresh space in which to do it.

Thus, one of the first things you should do this break is take a day to clean up the year's mess. Toss out those stacks of paper you'll no longer need, or if you struggle to part with all the meticulous notes you diligently kept, fearful they might come in handy during the coming year, then devise a filing system which will not only keep your space tidy over summer, but can increase your workflow as academia slowly swallows the entirety of your schedule.

New Year's in June

Aside from simply tidying up your physical space, you should also tidy up your mental space, and use this time to take inventory of the past year. What hindered your ability to get things done? What assignments did you struggle with? How can you refresh and rebuild your physical workspace to make for a more efficient and stress-free mental one? Simply put, conduct a personal annual review; make a list of what you learned, your achievements, what didn't go as planned, and use that to inform your priorities moving forward. January 1 doesn't have to be the only time for New Year's resolutions.

Shadow of Your Future Self

We all know the importance of landing an internship to bolster your college application and help you stand out amidst a crowd of candidates. Unfortunately though, there's only so many internships to go around, even fewer of which are open to high school students, with those numbers dwindling the lower your age bracket. Even still, that shouldn't stop you from trying to get into the workforce one way or another!

Find a local business you admire and ask if you could job shadow one of their employees for anywhere from a day to a week. It's a much smaller commitment for everyone involved, and it shows them that you're willing to do whatever it takes to get your proverbial foot in the door. What's more, a job shadow today could lead to an internship tomorrow.

The Student Becomes the Teacher

At the end of last year, LinkedIn analyzed hundreds of thousands of job postings on its site in an effort to suss out the professional skills that were most sought after in 2019. They split their findings into two sets of skills, hard skills and soft skills. Whereas hard skills are those which are specific to a particular industry or major such as User Experience (UX) Design, Artificial Intelligence, and Cloud Computing, soft skills are a bit harder to quantify, and can't necessarily be taught in the traditional sense. As such, Time Management, Adaptability, Collaboration, Persuasion, and Creativity were found to be the five most in-demand soft skills of 2019. Moreover, according to the same data, 57 percent of senior leaders agreed that soft skills are more important than hard skills, and that both are more important than experience, when assessing candidates.

The preference for soft skills is due largely to the fact that, firstly, no matter how advanced robots get, they'll never be able to automate the inherent humanistic qualities of soft skills, and secondly, you can always teach someone how to use software or program an algorithm, but it's generally more difficult to teach someone how to manage their time properly or be a team player.

Unfortunately, as mentioned, soft skills can be difficult to quantify on paper. Of course, you can point to things like group projects to highlight collaboration, or extracurriculars like debate club to showcase your powers of persuasion or arts clubs to demonstrate creativity. However these after school activities will only appeal to a select group of students, and group projects will apply to just about every student. So where's the happy medium?

One option is to become a mentor during the summer months. Find a subject you excel at and offer to help your peers, or even a younger student who may be entering that class the following year. Despite the fact that what you mentor will focus on a single area of study, the act of mentoring is multidisciplinary, and could tick every soft skill box on a hiring manager's list of qualifications.

By devising a curriculum and a weekly agenda to help your mentee learn a subject, you are exercising time management and creativity. Given the diversity of learning styles, and the fact that whoever you're working with is already struggling to grasp a topic, you'll have to be adaptable to help them learn. As we all know, it can be difficult to focus when faced with a challenge, so you'll doubtlessly have to be persuasive to keep your student engaged. And any instructor will tell you, teaching is very much a collaborative effort between student and teacher.

The beauty of all this being, if you can help a friend raise their grade in a certain class, you have a quantifiable testament to the efficacy of your soft skills!

Structure Something! Anything!

If you haven't gotten the hint yet, the name of the game here is to come up with a plan before your summer starts, and stick to it. Though it may seem counterintuitive, and frankly dreadful, to bog down the freewheeling nature of these sun-soaked days with a bunch of obligations, it's necessary to ensure that you won't come out the other side having accomplished nothing. We're certainly not suggesting that you dedicate 40 hours a week to a world that feels like school, just without the class bells. Nevertheless, we are suggesting that you find something you're passionate about and dig into it. After all, you never know what you might find.

Social Networking...IRL

Another alternative to the internship route is to reach out to local professionals and ask if they wouldn't mind sitting down with you over a cup of coffee or tea while you "pick their brain". This is a great way to gain insight into an industry that interests you. If you're an aspiring animator or television writer, these folks can tell you what makes a portfolio unique. If business and econom-ics are more your speed, veterans of the trade can shed light on how the field has changed over the last ten years, and what it might look like ten years on.

Surprisingly enough, according to Brett Schilke, Director of Impact at Silicon Valley's Singularity University, the three professions most at risk for disruption and automation in the near future are accountant, physician, and pharmacist. So sitting down with a person currently navigating these shifting landscapes will do wonders for your own plans.

Perhaps the most advantageous part of job shadowing and reaching out to local professionals is the fact that it will introduce you to a wide variety of different career paths, especially if you don't already know what your calling is. Basically, instead of dedicating all three months of your summer to a single internship, which you may find you hate after one week, job shadowing and speaking with professionals will offer a wealth of information about career opportunities, such that as the latter years of your high school tenure approach, you'll have a better understanding of where you want to intern, or what you want to major in.

Not to mention, sitting down with professionals and job shadowing a variety of folks will vastly increase your social network, making those internships that much easier to get, and college admissions packets all the more robust, later down the road.





From the Classroom to the World

Beijing's international schools are going above and beyond to prepare students for the future

t's the job of every education institution to prepare their students for anything that the future has in store for them. What's the point of achieving academic excellence if students aren't equipped with the social awareness to put their education to use? We had a chat with two of Beijing's international schools about their strategy for helping their students succeed both academically and emotionally.

Like with relationships, not every student finds their ideal match the first time. There are so many different types of curricula offered at international schools that it's almost impossible to not find one that's the perfect fit for your child. But, for the students who didn't find their match the first time around, transferring to a new school is no easy task. There's the academic aspect that the student will need to catch up on along with the social aspect, where they'll need to integrate themselves into a completely new circle of friends.

Adjusting to a brand new education environment is no small feat. Canadian International School of Beijing's (CISB) Vice Principal Matthew Doige explains his schools methods in helping transfer students adjust to life at CISB. "First, we put together an orientation package that's headed up by our school counselors who become the point person for that orientation program. So, in addition to receiving a schedule, the student will also have a tour arranged by the counselor, and more. We feel that connection with the school counselor is important, because any transition issues that come up, that we might need to deal with in a more individualized manner, will most often involve the school counselors. Since they already have

built up a little bit of a relationship, they know the school counselor is someone they can go to if problems pop up," Doige tells beijingkids. It's like welcoming someone into your home. The CISB community doesn't just stop at the door when it comes to new students. Taking the time and effort to make a

new student feel welcomed and at home in a new school plays a vital role in a student's successful academic career.

The system of a trusted counselor gives transfer students the sense of safety, that no matter what, there's an adult who's looking out for them, "We're pretty familiar with some of the issues that can occur with transitions. For instance: a student that is coming from an entirely different school system could have some academic concerns. In



that case, the Grade Level Lead (GLL) is an important part of assisting that student to transition," says Doige. But it's not all about academics. "Especially in Middle/High School — those are very difficult years in terms of personal development, and understanding yourself in relation with other people, and sometimes being in that environment can require some extra support to make sure that a student is socially integrated in that new setting. Our GLLs as well as our school counsellors, assist with that, along with our Response to Intervention System which allows teachers to monitor and see what's happening in class with new students, and then bring any

issues forward so that we can deal with them in a timely, proactive manner."

With the groundwork in place, transfer students can get accustomed to the new school enviwronment both socially and academically much quicker. "In the second part of the orientation we buddy transfer





students up with students who might have similar backgrounds or interests that we identify during the admission process or in talking with school counselors. The buddy's role is to help the transfer student adjust to life at CISB, ensuring that they get to their new classes on time, load up their meal cards, and find After School Activities (ASAs) which interest them where they can start making new friends and settling in."

After settling into a new school environment, it's the duty of each school to help shape the student to become contributing global citizens. Schools like Western Academy of Beijing (WAB) actively encourage its students to think outside of the campus and the city, and step into a global mindset. WAB's annual Global Issue Conference (GIC), headed by teacher Lorraine McMullen, is an event that was created specifically for students to help them think globally.

The goal of GIC is to explore and raise awareness about real world global challenges today. "This is a student-led initiative which creates a platform to inspire action on a local level," Mc-Mullen tells beijingkids. "This year over 170 students planned, created, and hosted a full day of workshops around the theme of 'Act for Impact'."

WAB extended an invitation to leaders in the local community to come in and share their knowledge and expertise with the students, guiding and inspiring them to think on a larger scale. "Under the guidance of the school's CAS [Creativity, Activity, Service] coordinator, this entire event was put together and managed by a student planning committee. Everything from the yearly theme and logo design, to the logistics of the day are student-driven!" McMullen proudly tells us.

Initiatives like GIC at WAB are among the hundreds that international schools around Beijing are developing to go above and beyond books and classrooms, and better prepare their students for the world. Students at Beijing's international schools are able to test out their leadership skills and ideas in a safe and encouraging environment.





Food for Though

What it takes to serve school meals

here are many criteria that parents look at when deciding which school to enroll their children into. While teachers, curriculum, location, and safety are all aspects that parents readily review, food quality is a feature that is gaining evermore attention. As the meals served in schools are increasingly scrutinized, schools are taking notice and are paying special attention to make sure their students are eating nutritious, unique, and delicious cuisine on a daily basis.

One catering management company called Compass Group is an example of a global business that focuses on serving quality food to its clients. Compass Group has already built a reputation in the food catering management world serving more than 5 billion meals a year and operating in over 50 countries. Their brand that specializes in catering management to schools is known as Chartwells.

Chartwells is currently working with more than 18 education locations in Beijing. Some familiar schools they work with include Keystone Academy, Beanstalk International Bilingual School (BIBS), Western Academy of Beijing (WAB), The British School of Beijing, Shunyi (BSB Shunyi), the British School of Beijing, Sanlitun (BSB Sanlitun), and the French International School of Beijing (LFIP) just to name a few. It has a wealth of knowledge in how to properly cater a balanced diet to students across the country. We had an opportunity to speak with Tony Xue, Regional Director of Compass Group, about how Chartwells operates and prepares their school meals to make sure students get the right kind of food to keep them healthy, focused, and full of energy.

Chartwells prides itself on its recognition as a global brand. Based on its experience from serving food to clients all around the world, it has a keen understanding of who exactly their customers are and how important it is to cater to their needs. Given that "Students and teachers are from different countries," they meet the needs of both by serving food from the West, Asia, Middle East, and other cuisines, along with using their global position to "invite guest chefs from all over the world...to optimize [their] menus and recipes." Although Chartwells focuses on serving students global cuisine, it also serves local Chinese food for international schools in China. Its menus may include items such as cottage pie or falafel, but it also makes sure items like Shanghai braised pork is present as well.

Xue said that to understand the needs of its customers, Chartwells regularly consults with them. It has been working with School Food Committees that are composed of students, teachers, and parents, and holds regular meetings with them to get feedback about the quality of their food and service, and to provide a place to give solutions accordingly. Chartwells also makes an effort to collaborate with parents by cooperating with the PTA to organize food events. As for its communication with students, its unit managers and head chefs talk with them during dining periods to get direct feedback about the food quality and make observations about how the students are eating to gain a better understanding of food preferences.

Olivier Mallard, General Manager at LFIP and also one of the chefs from Chartwells, told us that he always makes the effort to talk to

students. One of his findings was that most students love chicken nuggets. Instead of telling them to stop eating this junk food, he decided to show a documentary explaining how nuggets are made. His approach of "showing, not telling" has actually gotten students to pay more attention to the nutritional value of the food they eat. He even offers classes to educate students about the importance of healthy eating.

By working directly with those it is serving, Chartwells makes an effort to ensure that its food is not only safe for consumption but also nutritious as well. Its method of making sure their food is safe for students is through the creation of the HSE (Health, Safety and Environment) Department that inspects the ingredients from the suppliers it uses, and also monitors the meals itself once its served in the canteens. Chartwells' chefs also use the System Analysis and Program system (SAP) to order ingredients for their menu. The SAP is used to decide which supplier is available for the schools and whether they deliver safe items after already being evaluated by the company.

Along with food safety, Chartwells' other main focus is the nutritional value of its meals. It has strict requirements on which ingredients are allowed to be present in their meals: items such as MSG, peanut oil, and horse beans are forbidden. Healthy cooking procedures also take place as meals are cooked with less oil and contain low salt and sugar content, and Chartwells nutritionists' advice would normally be taken into consideration for their meal offers so students are receiving a balanced meal. Allergy control procedures are followed in the schools that Chartwells works with as the schools collect a list of known allergies from their student body and provide it to the catering management company so meals that can cause allergic reactions are not served.

As important as nutritional food can be for students, it won't mean much if they aren't tasty enough for students to even try them. In order to break the monotony of canteen food that some students may expect to eat, Chartwells tries to make the dining experience of students exciting by holding theme day events such as Chinese Festival Day, Korean Food Day, or Mexican Food Day. Apart from these themed food events, it also holds an event known as Beyond Food in which its own chefs or guest chefs teach consumers how to make food such as pizza, cakes, or dumplings. Along with learning how to make food with the chefs, Chartwells nutritionists also teach classes for students to be better educated about the food they eat.

Chartwells of Compass Group is just one example of a school food catering company serving meals to the thousands of students enrolled in international schools around Beijing and elsewhere in the world. Just like Chartwells, many schools, parents, and catering companies are recognizing how important a safe, healthy, and delicious meal could be for students. As studies show how nutritious school meals are linked to higher performing academic results, the food students eat in schools will only continue to grow in importance as part of a child's school experience.

Which scholarship were you awarded?

I was awarded the bronze scholarship.

Why did you decide to apply for your scholarship?

— I decided to apply for it because it feels great that I can get some rewards for the efforts I paid, and help my parents reduce some expenditure on my education. The more important reason is that the scholarship represents the school's appreciation for my work, and it motivates me to work harder in the future.

Can you tell us a little about the application process?

— First, I needed to decide which scholarship I wanted to apply for. Then, I filled in an application form to show my basic information. The form was finally given to the teachers and the school to check.

What does this scholarship mean to you?

— It means that my efforts and work are appreciated by the school, and it feels great that I can achieve some goals through my hard work.

What advice do you have for other students who might be thinking about applying for a scholarship?

 I would tell them to find a specific interest and work hard on it. The most important thing here is perseverance and dedication. You have to pay efforts for your interest, and it would be better if your interest can make others benefit from it.

What do you think helped you stand out from other applicants?

— I did a lot of work to spread the knowledge of lumbar disc herniation through the Internet. I helped a lot of people learn how to prevent this disease and how to cure it. My work can be transferred into quantitative data, because the number of views of the original video I made about this disease exceeded 50,000. I think my achievement here is that I've really helped others through my work.



FACULTY INSIGHT -YANLI LI

What do you look for in a scholarship applica-

- There are different requirements of Huijia School Scholarship for different awards:
- 1. Academic awards: Academic performance is the main evaluation criteria, and daily learning performance and English level are particularly important; in addition, the comprehensive quality of students is also considered, such as students' leadership skills, organizational skills. communication skills, service awareness and sense of responsibility, etc.
- 2. Special awards: Emphasize students' outstanding performance in various special fields, such as in literature, art, sports, technology, humanities, computer, artificial intelligence, scientific research, and innovation. All students with outstanding achievements in a certain area can apply for special scholarships.

Do you expect more from a student who is awarded a scholarship?

— We hope that students who receive scholarships can continue to maintain excellent quality, set a good example, actively help and influence others, and encourage more students to join the team of outstanding learners.

What kinds of questions can a student expect to be asked during a scholarship interview?

— Questions include: what kind of scholarship are you applying for? Why apply for a scholarship? Do you think you will apply successfully? Why?

On average, how many students apply for a scholarship in a given field?

— At present, we provide about 80 students with different levels of awards in terms of scholarships each year. There are about 25 students who can get special awards, and are mostly concentrating on artistic creation, golf, ice hockey, artificial intelligence, computer programming, and other aspects.

Aside from getting a free or reduced tuition, what are the other advantages of being awarded a scholarship?

- The school provides scholarships for outstanding grade 12 graduates to help them complete university studies better.

For students with outstanding achievements in scientific research or innovation projects, the school provides certain project funds to help them complete their own research projects and innovation results.

What advice would you give to a student who's thinking about applying for a scholarship?

— We encourage all eligible students to apply for a school scholarship. Please get to know the scholarship policy in advance through the admissions office, and prepare related certification ma-terials according to various evaluation standards. The submission must be completed before the application date set by school.

ONE SIZE Overvit Fit All

How two schools approach special education and inclusive curriculum design

t's no secret that the one-size-fits-all model which has historically dominated educational institutions is increasingly contested as an equitable and sustainable pedagogical approach. Thanks to a litany of new studies, curriculum developers who are willing to take risks, a rapidly changing world in which rote memorization and conveyor belt academia no longer prepares kids for the future, and a general acceptance of diverse minds within any given student body, more and more professionals in the education sector are beginning to realize that if we truly want children to succeed, we have to work with them, instead of demanding that they work with us.

Part and parcel of this conversation is a much-needed paradigm shift in what it means to be a special needs learner. In fact, according to UNESCO, a special needs education is quite broadly defined as an, "Education designed to facilitate the learning of individuals who, for

a wide variety of reasons, require additional support and adaptive pedagogical methods in order to participate and meet learning objectives in an educational program." Furthermore, UNESCO defines reasons for being a special needs learner as including, but not limited to, "disadvantages in physical, behavioral, intellectual, emotional, and social capacities."

So it should come as no surprise that Beijing's international school community, which has a demonstrable track record in educational innovation and curriculum design, is also a hotbed for special needs advocacy and holistic approaches to inclusive pedagogical standards of care.

Of the 58 schools profiled in this year's School Choice Guide, more than half of them offer extra help for students who need it. We spoke with two of them, 3e International School and The International School of Beijing (ISB), to get a better idea of what a special needs education looks like, and what resources are available for students who exhibit atypical learning styles.

Dr. Ira Canada is a learning specialist at 3e International School. When asked about 3e's approach to a special needs education, he stressed the importance of establishing a learning philosophy, stating, "We believe in providing access to standards-based learning through a multisensory and differentiated instructional approach, with the intention of unlocking the genius in all of our students. Teachers use a differentiated approach to instruction, and they understand a students' needs and plan accordingly. We have a committed Learning Support Program which is designed to support the child, the teachers and the family."

Likewise, ISB approaches learning through a collaborative process that focuses on understanding each student's learning profile and personalizing instruction to match student needs. Students with learning disabilities





are provided accommodations that offer access to their grade level content and where necessary, a modified curriculum tailored to the student's individual learning needs. The school uses a variety of assessment tools to better understand student learning and guide instruction, challenging each student at their individual level of achievement. For English language learners, the school implements a Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP) approach, with a focus on cultural proficiency, when teaching students English. English proficiency is monitored and assessed using the WIDA assessment tool, a widely used assessment tool in international schools around the world.

It is also important to note that, oftentimes, students suspected of being within the spectrum of special needs learners might actually be experiencing minor, adjustable issues which inhibit learning faculties, such as with language. As Dr. Canada points out, "We are mindful that often language needs and learning needs may actually manifest in similar ways. What may appear as a learning need, may actually come down to issues with language and communication." As a result, 3e International School recently strengthened their Learning Support Program (LSP) to accommodate the diversity of its student body. Essentially, because the school serves students in a dual language format, distinguishing communication deficits from specific learning needs is important. By focusing on these areas and installing language supports

that encourage communication, the behaviors are extinguished and attention can be given to genuine educational needs.

When it comes to boots on the ground, so to speak, both ISB and 3e International School have an impressive roster of support staff.

At ISB, for instance, students have access to speech and language pathologists, counselors, learning support teachers and instructional assistants, as well as an on-site occupational therapist. However, this is just the beginning of a long-term strategy towards fully integrating students with special needs into campus life. In fact, by August, ISB will have introduced new initiatives for students diagnosed with intellectual and cognitive disabilities including global developmental delay, autism spectrum disorder, Down syndrome, fragile X syndrome, and cerebral palsy.

And at 3e International School, teachers regularly participate in trainings, the most recent of which focused on self-regulation skills. Similarly, future courses will address strategies for working with learners on the autism spectrum, and Universal Design for Learning (UDL).

As they say, it takes a village to raise a child, and thus the onus of care shouldn't fall on educators and staff alone. In fact, schools like 3e are also examining ways to include parents in their long-term strategies. "Parents participate in monthly Tea Talks," explains Dr. Canada. "These informative sessions give parents advice and strategies to deal with challenging situations as parents. Our first Tea Talk, 'Positive Parenting Strategies', provided parents with valuable advice to help them implement simple strategies to maximize the likelihood of challenging behavior situations." This approach ensures that progress made by trained professionals working with special needs students in the school are further enforced, and ultimately enhanced, by parents at home.

The challenges of parenting are unlike any other that we face, a Sisyphean struggle that lasts well beyond your child's maturation. Add to that a unique set of tribulations outside the purview of those which other parents encounter, and it's enough to feel like you and your child are completely alone in the world. Nevertheless, thanks to folks like Dr. Canada and his colleagues at 3e International School, as well as the team at ISB, those who have dedicated themselves to the admirable task of understanding diagnoses which have been historically, and often severely, misunderstood, there is hope for families whose children live with disabilities, and those who fall within the ever-expanding spectrum of special needs learners.

Realizing your student's potential through outstanding extracurricular activities

xtracurricular activities (ECAs) are often framed as a means to an end, a way for students to stand out amongst a crowded field of college applicants. More importantly ■ though, they're a chance for kids to dig deeper into a field they are passionate about, and which is either glossed over, or entirely absent from their regular curriculum. From debate to drama and student maga-zines to radio, these programs are a vital

resource for enthusiastic learners, eager to pick up re-al-world skills, gain insights into various career choices, and ultimately accelerate their profes-sional development.

While every school within Beijing's international education community offers a plethora of ECAs, we've highlighted four, from early years through high school, to give you an idea of what's on offer for your child.

STAGECATS

Canadian International School Beijing (CISB)

A collaborative theater community of students and teachers, who rehearse and perform a range of productions - including well-known plays and musicals as well as original pieces, which are devised through collaboration with students, a process that involves focused discussions, improv exercises on play themes and workshopping / re-working scenes with student input.





Helion Robotics

Dulwich College Beijing (DCB)

Helion Robotics is the name of Dulwich College Beijing's FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) Extra Curricular Activity club. The student-led team of nearly 40, including students from Year 8-13 and four teacher mentors, meets once a week offseason, and much more frequently during competition time. Member roles cover everything from engineering, construction, design, market-ing, and finance, and the team is always looking to expand and improve. Each year, Helion in-vests hundreds of hours to design and build one robot which will be used to compete in team-based competitions requiring them to overcome challenges through skilled programming and en-gineering. Helion Robotics was awarded the Highest Rookie Seed at the FIRST Robotics Compe-tition Midwest Regionals in 2019.





PROJECT THINK (HD DESIGN THINKING FAIR)

HD School Beijing

Design Thinking (DT) is one of HD's specialty curricula that aims to build their students into real-world problem finders and problem solvers with innovative thinking and agency. It's an in-depth opportunity for Design Thinking immersion, in which DT teachers lead two groups of stu-dents through an immersive four week project. Under the guidance of the DT teachers, each stu-dent identified a real-world issue, then designed and built his/her own solution. During the final session, students present their projects to their parents. Past works have included Vacation Pet Feeder, Oil Protection Suit, Marker Machine, Plant Watering Machine, and Turtle Feeder Machine.

Sensory Play Activities (F-1)

Hope International School

Sensory play uses all five senses (sight, touch, smell, hearing, and taste). This Sensory Play ECA will assist young children in developing fine motor skills and important cognitive skills used for problem solving.



BIG SCHOOL, SMALL SCHOOL

Does school size matter?

lew parents would disagree that class size is an important issue when it comes to choosing a school. A huge body of evidence supports the idea that children learn better in smaller groups. While critics point out that reducing class size is not a panacea, since it relies on having an increased pool of trained, skilled teachers, most international schools in Beijing have teaching groups smaller than the global average of 24.1 students.

However in recent years attention has turned to a different issue: the size of schools themselves. Data which showed smaller schools among the best performing led billionaire Bill Gates to spend a great deal of money pushing for the break up of bigger institutions. However the assumption was based on a misunderstanding of statistics: smaller samples have more variation, so smaller schools were also among the worst performing!

Since then the debate has raged across the educational sector. Studies supporting the idea have been challenged for not taking into account other factors, while proponents of small schools claim they are better for students' social development. There is even disagreement as to what should be considered a "small school", some insisting it means fewer than 500 students, others counting anything up to 900 as small. And while a school with over 1,000 students might seem big, that's tiny compared to many Chinese high schools, with rolls in five figures, or the world's largest school in Lucknow, India, which has a staggering 50,000 students.

To explore the pros and cons of school size, we talked to leaders from two of Beijing's fastest growing institutions. Samantha Corset is Executive Assistant to the head of school and Director of Campus Coordination at Beijing International Bilingual Academy (BIBA).

"BIBA was founded in 2006," she told us, "and through 13 years of dedicated and hard work by all staff, the school has transformed itself from a small school with four teachers and 44 students in the first year, to now a school including an Early Childhood Center (ECC), an Elementary School (ES) and a Middle/High School (MS/HS) with about 1,660 students and 330 members of staff. The school's mission is, through a blending of Eastern and Western philosophies, to inspire students to be rigorous, balanced and independent life-long learners; to develop compassion and positive relationships; to respect and appreciate the world in which they live; and to understand their role and responsibility in a global community."

Beijing Xin Fuxue School is, as its name suggests, one of the newest high schools on the city's educational scene. But, as co-principal Gary Dimitratos told us, its roots go back a long way.

"Shuntian Fuxue was founded in 1985 by Mr. Lu, as an education center for mathematics. He is a well-known math teacher in Beijing, who's coached a lot of students who have gone on to study abroad at Princeton and Harvard. From that, Cynthia [Xing, the school's Executive Principal] worked with him to develop an elementary and middle school. I met them during a summer, and had a fruitful conversation about educational philosophies, based on an intimate class setting and hands-on education. After that I came to this school as the founding foreign principal.

"We started enrolling in May 2017, and our doors opened in August 2017 with 45 students and worked it up to 450. It's a K12 school [kindergarten to grade 12], with a mix of international and local students from all over northern China. We have no classroom larger than 15-18 students, once they get beyond that we split them into two."

The bigger school has slightly larger classes, around 20 to 22 students, though this is still well below average. But Corset emphasized the support provided by BIBA's homeroom system.

"In Middle and High School we have an international teacher as homeroom teacher for two classes, and we may have a Chinese teacher per class. In Elementary we have one international homeroom teacher per class, and we might have Chinese teacher support. Also in Middle and High School we have an advisory program, where students meet in an advisory group. As we're a positive education school, they're practicing mindfulness every day.

"The house program runs parallel to the homeroom system," she continued. "We use it to support our vision and mission, what we call the 4 R's: Rigor, Respect, Responsibility and Relationships. During house program time we focus on developing social skills."

Beijing Xin Fuxue School has similar arrangements for pastoral care, Dimitratos told us.









"We have an international teacher and a Chinese teacher for each homeroom. And we have a house system, so they can compete with each other. We've just had a soccer tournament, we have academic and physical competitions, and house assemblies. There are six houses, each a different color, and another thing we've done is to allow them to pick an animal, to create a poster, their own logo and banner."

Larger campuses with more facilities is one area where bigger schools can claim an advantage. Corset proudly told us about what BIBA has to offer:

"An indoor gymnasium with three indoor basketball courts and various sports facilities catering for both Early Childhood students through to grade 12 students, arts and technology centers, and a STEAM room, as well as separate school buildings for Early Childhood, Lower Elementary and Upper Elementary School."

Dimitratos though, argues that smaller schools don't need to mean students are missing out.

"It's a small school, but a big location. We have modern classrooms, a bubble gym with an air purifying machine, a basketball court and badminton court. We have a soccer pitch, an outdoor basketball court and running track, and a sun room. When we need something they will build it: we built an auditorium this year that can seat 400 plus people."

He sees the school's size as part of its appeal.

"We're offering parents an education for their children in a small, intimate classroom setting. I've been a principal for seven years, and I like the family feel, the atmosphere. I can go round and get to know all the children, help them get the confidence to be successful learners. I'm not stuck in the office doing paperwork or in meetings all day. This school has been a real big boost for me. I've been able to do a lot of guest speaking, as an advocate for bilingual education and my educational philosophy. I can see the kids in the morning before school, have personal relationships with the teachers and the families as well as the students. I know everyone on a first name basis, and when a school goes over 400 students that can be difficult. The family feel is something parents and students have commented on."

At BIBA, communication is key to ensuring that being a big school doesn't mean losing cohesion.

"We have three divisions, Early Years, Elementary, and Middle/High, and three principals," Corset said. "It tends to get very busy! So one of the things that we focus on is communication. We use email for formal communication, WeChat is only for outward communication, for example a notice about a dental check. Our aim is for parents to discuss on email about their personal situation rather than in a public forum. We have a social media policy to protect children.

"We also have regular meetings. The principals meet weekly, the heads of department meet regularly, and we have a whole staff meeting once a month. And every teacher meets to discuss their professional development. Last year Geelong Grammar School in Australia came

out and did a training for the whole school in Positive Education. We celebrate things together too! We have an annual staff party, and ice cream parties after school for the whole staff."

Involving parents is also vital to creating a sense of community, Corset said.

"We have an active Parent Teacher Association (PTA) with 300 core members, who are very involved in school life. They work together as a parent community. That's one of the things that's quite special about the school. We believe in lifelong learning, not just for students but also for parents. We have classes and activities run by and for parents on campus.

"Any school has a community which can be divided," Corset continued. "Something we work hard on is to identify our differences but also recognize similarities, so that we're not defined by our differences. What's really wonderful is that we have a large staff of over 370, and we have an array of activities that are staff-led after school, open to all staff, whether Chinese or international. We work really hard to be inclusive."

We asked her what she sees as the key benefit of being a big school. "Generally a bigger school will have been developed over a period of time. That sort of history creates a space for schools to be confident in their unique features. We're in our thirteenth year, and having that time, you know where your strengths are. For BIBA it's our merging or blending of Western and Eastern culture. Our role is to love and grow the students."

As a new school, Beijing Xin Fuxue is growing and developing the structures to underpin its community.

"We organized a PTA this year. They help put on events, like the winter show, spring concert, and parent-teacher meetings, to review our mission statement and school learning objectives. Parents can also come to school to view open classes, and give feedback on how the teaching is going. We've also done a community shoe box appeal for migrant children, and went out and delivered them as a school. We have a family day every year, families come and the students put on performances, not just for parents, but for the community. They put on an art show, performances, food, and games."

We wondered whether Xin Fuxue might continue growing, so that it becomes no longer a "small school."

"I don't know about the future plans of the organization, whether we will expand into other campuses, but to be honest I'm still advocating for a small school setting. The school is only two years old, and it's grown quickly. We're always looking for ways to take parent and student feedback, and incorporate that. For me as a principal I'm working with the people around me to offer the best education, to get everything in place in terms of assessment and student achievement. It's a forward-thinking school, and as a foreigner I'm proud to work here. The last two years have been refreshing."
