

For ECE/Kindergarten:

Montessori

The Montessori approach was founded on the belief that every child should be respected as an individual and allowed to learn at their own pace within the classroom environment. Children are usually taught in mixed-aged classrooms rather than grades, and teachers and classroom assistants will create individualized teaching and development plans that foster a child's physical and spiritual learning.

Examples: Etonkids International Kindergartens, AnRic Little Montessori Room

Reggio Emilia

Reggio Emilia is an innovative approach to early years education in which children are seen as unique, creative individuals who embark on a journey into learning from the moment they're born. Students are active designers of their own educational development based on an environment where they are free to explore and ask questions.

Examples: Western Academy of Beijing



International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate (IB) has a 52-year history of providing high-quality international education. It's taught at schools around the world and since the IB Diploma is recognized by the world's top universities, IB is a natural choice for many expat families. IB schools must be authorized and accredited to offer one or all of the following programs: the Primary Years Programme or PYP (ages 3-12), the Middle Years Programme or MYP (ages 11-16), and the Diploma Programme or IBDP (ages 16-19).

Examples: Beijing No. 55 High School International Students Section, Western Academy of Beijing, Beijing City International School

Hybrid Curriculum

The Hybrid Curriculum can be described as "the best of both worlds." Some schools in Beijing apply a combination of the Chinese National Curriculum and an internationally recognized one. This flexible learning approach helps equip students with a broad range of international education experiences. Core subjects from the Chinese National Curriculum may be taught, but the underlying teaching approach may be more Western.

Examples: Keystone Academy

Bilingual Approach

This is less of a curriculum in itself and more of an approach to teaching. Many international schools in Beijing teach in two languages, usually English and Chinese. The linguistic split varies between schools. It can either be 50:50 or 30:70, and students could be taught by co-teachers in different languages or taught in different languages on different days. This approach is created in hopes of fostering well-rounded international individuals that are well-equipped to face a job market that increasingly requires multiple languages.

Examples: Yew Chung International School of Beijing, Daystar Academy

Meet the Woman IN CHARGE

How Beijing United Family Hospital General Manager Sylvia Pan blazes new trails and trends

Much is said nowadays about finding the right work-life balance, however, Sylvia Pan, the soft-spoken general manager of Beijing United Family Hospital (BJU) finds a different meaning in the motto. For her, balancing work and life – in which she pulls double duty as both a caring mother and dedicated leader of one of the capital's preeminent medical institutions – means recognizing the lessons learned in one and applying them to the other. "The ways to resolve problems in life and work are sometimes similar," says Pan, with a smile.

It's an interdisciplinary approach gleaned from her years spent working as a translator for the military, and one that has served her and her community exceptionally well for the more than 25 years that she's helmed BJU's mission. Perhaps more importantly though, it's helped her navigate the sometimes murky waters of a professional parent with grace, agility, and aplomb.



From servicewoman to healthcare professional

After earning an English degree in 1990, Pan took up work in the military's translation office. At a time when the majority of her colleagues were studying English so they could move and work abroad, choosing to dedicate her life to serving the country she so loves made Pan something of an outlier among her classmates.

What's more, that military career cultivated a unique sense of perseverance and courage that largely shaped the woman she is today. "There's a saying in English, 'hang in there,' and this is what actually lasts me through all the time," Pan tells Jingkids.

Since joining United Family in 1996, many people have asked Pan why, with seemingly no connection between the military and the healthcare industry, she would choose to join a sino-foreign medical institution and work there for more than 25 years.

For Pan, the logic is simple and rooted not only in her love of helping others but also in constantly striving to do better. "The military and hospitals have something in common – they both can have significant impacts on people's lives. United Family has introduced me to a completely new world. It satisfied my curiosity, and the people around me encourage me to keep learning and improving myself." Likewise, she credits her six years in the military with inspiring her lifelong dedication to the job. "The military has marked me with perseverance and endurance, which gave me the strength to 'hang in there' during the most difficult times."

A trendsetter in China

As China continues developing at a rapid pace, so too have Pan and United Family consistently reinvented themselves over the past 25 years, anticipating new trends and blazing new trails in response to the times. "As a professional manager, one of my missions and abilities is to learn how to recognize the trends," says Pan. "This is very important."

For instance, when Beijing hosted the 2008 Summer Olympics, Beijing United Family Hospital recruited emergency room doctors from abroad to prepare for an influx of foreign visitors. However, the anticipated international patients never arrived. As a result, United Family reversed

its customer strategy, shifting its key marketing focus from foreign to local clients, and began promoting itself among Chinese enterprises and communities.

"At that time, most of our doctors were full-time foreign doctors," says Pan. "However, a healthy human resources structure should be spindle-shaped, not dumbbell-shaped. So we had to upgrade the HR structure for our doctors. With the shift in United Family's target clients, the hospital began to recruit outstanding Chinese doctors." By refocusing its target clients, Beijing United Family Hospital has been able to cover a broader market and kick-start its high-speed, high-quality development.

More recently, China's sustained low birth rate and increasingly aging society have prompted Pan to develop new goals for United Family. She points to places such as Japan, the US, and Europe as experiencing the same issues, but adds "our national conditions are different," though "we are going in similar directions in some aspects."

Full-time general manager and full-time adoring mom

Though Pan's penchant for pivoting, adapting, and adjusting to whatever life throws at her has proved indispensable in the workplace, as the mother of a son and daughter 10 years apart, it's at home and in her parenting style that she truly shines. For instance, given the disparity in their ages, Pan figured out pretty early on that one of her magic weapons would be making sure that neither child feels neglected or forgotten. For example, even on the day his little sister was born, Pan made sure she was available to help her son with his homework in the hospital room after giving birth. "My son was very sensitive to the new addition in the family, even though he didn't show it," says Pan, highlighting the importance of reliability for familial harmony. "As a parent, I need to show him that the routines have not changed in this family, and this brings him a sense of security."

Today, Pan's son is a teenager while her daughter is in first grade. The siblings have developed their own unique way of communicating with each other, and Pan proudly explains, "Most of the time, I stay out of their talks and leave things to them. Let them decide, so they won't look for their parents' help whenever they have a problem."

Simply put, Pan's parenting experience and prowess blend a high degree of discipline and endurance, as well as an ability to always stay one step ahead of the rest of the family, another feather in her cap from her military days, and not entirely different from how she anticipates problems in the workplace.


All of which is to say, whether she's acting as the general manager of Beijing United Family Hospital or a patient mother of two, Pan's de facto problem-solving strategy prioritizes those in her charge, which has helped her set new professional and parental trends when faced with any issue, big or small, in work and life.

What to Really Yook For at a

SCHOOL OPEN HOUSE

The facilities

Some things go without saying. Observe how well-kept the school grounds and facilities are, especially if there is real grass and trees. Overgrown shrubbery and stagnant drains will be breeding grounds for mosquitoes in summer and autumn, which increase the risk of diseases like encephalitis and dengue fever. It also says a lot about the school's economic status if they aren't able to maintain their premises. If the school has a pool, ask about the chlorine levels and how often it is cleaned. One really good way to test the school's facilities is to use them – so go ahead and visit the washroom, because if you can't bear to use it, you can bet your child won't either.

As a bonus question, ask if parents are allowed to use the school's facilities as well. Certain international schools allow parents to use facilities such as the gym or jogging track.





The food

If your children have any allergies, or if you don't yet know if they have any allergies, you should have this on your list of questions. But beyond making sure that the school knows how to prevent and handle food reactions, it is important to find out who is providing meals for your child. Most schools use an external caterer, so do some research on the company that will be feeding your child every day. A company that's had any history of food contamination should definitely be avoided, but even one that has not maintained a professional contract with a school for more than a year should raise red flags.

The language(s)

Depending on what you want for your child, ensure that the school has the capability to teach the language(s) you desire. Most international schools have at least an hour of Chinese language learning a day, but if this is not enough for you, look into a school that has a dual-language program where they teach all subjects in both languages.

Beyond the curriculum, however, what may be more important is the school environment – this consists of the staff as well as the students. The Open House is a great opportunity to find out what the other students are like and which languages they speak. Chances are your child will end up using the language they hear their peers use most often, so choose wisely.

The staff

It's best if you can find out who exactly your children's teachers will be and get to know them a little, especially how long they have worked at the school. If the teacher is new, try to meet them in person and see how they get along with you and your child. It is also wise to find out how much of the school staff is new, especially in important administrative and teaching positions. A school that has a high turnover rate may suggest that they don't invest in human resources, which could signal deeper problems. Also, as expats, we know the value of people sticking around, especially in our kids' lives. So try to make sure that the school teachers and staff intend to stay for a while.

The other parents

Your child's school is as much a choice for you as it is for your child. You're going to be in a WeChat group with the other parents and run into them at pick up and dropoff, school fairs, and the rest. So when you're at the Open House, look around and imagine spending some time with the other adults there. If that seems like time well spent, then you're probably making the right choice.







WHY EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AREN'T "EXTRA" AT ALL

They're a quintessential part of the school experience

Extracurriculars, after-school activities (ASA), or co-curricular activities (CCA) – whatever you may call them – are anything but an extravagance these days. Indeed, you might call them an essential experience, with a vast majority of international school kids from age 6 onwards taking part in their school's extracurricular program. There is a laundry list of compelling reasons why kids should take part in extracurricular activities after school, ranging from social development to the opportunity to achieve collegiate scholarships or even some level of fame and repute. That said, not all extracurricular programs are cre-

ated equal. We spoke with a top international school in Beijing to get the lowdown on choosing a quality extracurricular activity for your child.

Along with technological advances and the shifting zeitgeist towards sustainable humanitarian efforts, extracurricular activities at school have expanded a fair bit in the last decade, but some perennial favorites stand the test of time. Director of Student Activities at International School of Beijing (ISB) Simon Parker tells us, "I don't think the trend has changed too much in terms of what is popular – things which are popular here now have always been popular. The three activities with





the biggest volume of students across the whole school right now would probably be Strings/Orchestra, MUN, and basketball. However, we have a huge number of extremely popular activities that are consistently full, but for logistical reasons have slightly less student volume – swim, rock climbing, choir, mathletes, Habitat for Humanity to name a few."

While the extracurricular activities offered at schools may not have changed dramatically, one change is participation from a younger age. Parker shares, "We have witnessed more specialization at an early age. At present, about 75 percent of our Elementary School students are taking part in our after-school programs on campus, and over 60 percent of our Middle School students play on a sports team at some point in the school year." But don't worry if your kindergartener isn't particularly committed to a specific activity just yet. Parker continues, "Our philosophy at ISB is to encourage students to try many activities when they are younger and to specialize when they are a bit older. This supports our mission of allowing students the freedom to explore and discover their passions. We believe this helps provide a more holistic, well-rounded experience."

You'll also be glad to know that the vast majority of after-school programs at international schools in Beijing are run by staff members, or by direct partner organizations of the school, and as a result, the quality control is easier and managed in-house by the Activities Office. At ISB, there is a common proposal process for activities that guarantee sponsors are well qualified, and also allows them to make sure that each session or season there is a good balance of different types of programs for their students. "Given the scale of the program, it is

crucial for the program managers to have a keen handle on everything that is happening, and this is managed through a series of regular informal visits to all activities," Parker shares.

Having said all of that, my million-dollar question was whether there are certain extracurricular activities that look better on a child's transcript, thereby boosting their chances of getting accepted to college.

Sadly, there is no simple answer to this question. While it is clear that outstanding achievements in sports may earn a full-ride scholarship, the percentage of youth who do reach such achievements is less than 5 percent of the study body. So what happens to the rest of us?

These are Parker's insights: "The whole co-curricular program here is education-based and is aligned with the mission of the school, and the value placed on it can be best seen by not only the school's amazing facilities but also by how well resourced the ISB Activities Office is to manage these programs. We want students to be engaged, connect with things they like to do, join a team, have the opportunity to lead if they choose, serve the community, learn how to work effectively with others, experience success, and also learn how to deal with situations that might not go to plan, to have fun. Co-curricular experiences are the things that students remember about their time at school – that MUN conference, that volleyball tournament, those visits to the migrant village school, that dance performance. Our goal is to strategically build a program that will help every one of our ISB Dragons find that thing that they will be talking about for years to come, and that helped define them as an individual and helped make their school experience a memorable one."

Well, you're in luck. Because I have rounded up some of the most brilliant seniors and juniors to give you some tried-and-true advice!




0.1: How do you determine your dream school/college?

Juyeon K. a senior at BCIS in the IBDP program says:








O3: How do I determine what I want to major in?

Juyeon K.

"IB requires much effort and time, and you may not have enough time for extracurriculars or internship opportunities because of EE, TOK, and IAs. AP is more standardized than IB since IB students only get predicted scores not the actual ones. Taking AP may allow you to spend more time refining your university application and partake in extracurriculars."

Kathy S.

"IGCSEs are primarily for the UK universities while IB has more global recognition. In IGCSE, students usually take 10 subjects in preparation for the A-levels where it's condensed down to 3. So, the A-levels/IGCSE is really focused and for people who have a solid idea of what they want to do in the future."

29: Is the university ranking the most important thing to consider when choosing where to apply to? Linda H.

"Definitely not. No matter where I go, I'll still pursue my passion. For me personally, location is what matters. Because I want to study in Boston, all of the universities I had on my list were located in Boston. While people may say ranking is important, and it is to a certain extent, many other things such as the location, the culture, whether it's safe or not, matters a lot."

Q10: How many universities should I apply for?

"The UK universities go through a UCAS application and it has a limit of 5 schools. Another limit is that you can only apply for either Oxford or Cambridge. So, for students taking the IGCSE, your limit is 5."

Jenny

"I think 7-10, if you're doing the United States system, is a good idea so you don't overwork yourself. If you think you have time for more, then go for it. Just make sure you are comfortable and still able to keep up with your daily workload."

Can I Eat This?

Navigating allergies in Beijing's international schools

pon deciding we would relocate to Beijing, my first thought was not where we would live or what school our child would go to but rather, what will she eat in China? My child has multiple food allergies which we have lived with since she was a baby. After a reaction to kiwifruit at 9 months old, she then tested positive for peanuts and tree nuts a little while later. Around age 2 we discovered she was allergic to eggs – the reaction occurred at a birthday party which subsequently landed us in the Accident and Emergency ward to stop her profuse vomiting. Another reaction at age 4 while we were visiting relatives in Florida resulted in a trip to the hospital with an unconscious child who had to be given an IV – this time we experienced a very real kind of fear that only occurs when you realize your child is in serious danger. After each episode, your nerves are shot for a few weeks and you just want to wrap your child in cotton wool and never let them leave the house again.

How many people suffer from food allergies?

According to www.foodallergy.org, around 32 million Americans suffer from food allergies including 5.6 million children under age 18. This translates to one in 13 children or roughly two kids in every classroom. Across Australia, New Zealand, and the UK around 10 to 15 percent of the population – and in some cases 20 percent – are affected by food allergies.

According to the World Allergy Organisation, "Food allergies are increasing in both developed and developing countries, especially in children, and the severity and complexity of food allergies are also increasing. Food allergy can be fatal, and appropriate diagnosis is essential as is the need for food labeling worldwide."

Across Asia, food allergies are less common, representing some 3.5 percent to 11 percent of the population, but still considered comparable to Western countries.

What are the common food allergies?

Common food allergies include peanuts, tree nuts, eggs, dairy, wheat, and fish. In Asia, allergy to shellfish is most common.

My daughter is currently a Year 4 student at Yew Chung International School of Beijing (YCIS Beijing), and for obvious reasons, I'm exceptionally concerned when it comes to what food is provided in schools.

How do international schools in Beijing measure up when dealing with food allergies? Are they allergy-aware?

As international schools continue to welcome foreign students into their communities, teachers and staff can expect to have children with food allergies in their classrooms, some of which may be severe and/or result in anaphylaxis. Being able to provide a safe environment and a high standard of care for these students is imperative.

Western Academy of Beijing (WAB) for example, has a food allergy policy in place and its canteen provides options for people with allergens.

At YCIS Beijing, the canteen food is nut-free and the chef is very accommodating. However, given the complexity of our child's allergies, the safe option will always be to bring a lunch from home. Upon special request, class birthday cakes were banned last year.

Beyond the physical and sometimes life-threatening effects of allergies are the less recognized psychological effects of living with allergies. Imagine being 6-years-old and

having to sit in a corner of the classroom by yourself while your peers devour a cake for someone's birthday. Not once, but repeatedly. In fact, every single time someone has a birthday, which could potentially be 25 times a year! Add to that the other special occasions people gather for food – whether it be Halloween, Christmas, or Chinese New Year. As my child so simply put it, "Mummy, I'm tired of missing out." So tired in fact that I recently kept my child home from school on a day that I knew Santa would be visiting to hand out candy. I wanted to spare her the small heartache that comes from being left out yet again.

Importance of inclusion

When my child was very young, bringing her own food on outings and to restaurants was pretty straightforward. However, once she started kindergarten she began noticing that the other kids were able to eat food that she couldn't. Don't underestimate the desire all children have to belong and to be included. Watching my child cope with exclusion on a regular basis not only in educational settings but also at any social occasion was incredibly hard but also aweinspiring as I watched her take it in her stride. Over time, I have become deeply grateful to the friends of mine who, in going out of their way to make a dish my child can also eat or who delay giving their own child an ice cream until after mine has left, display their incredible empathy for us.

Advice for parents of children with allergies when choosing a school

Choosing a school in a foreign country is fraught with anxiety. Add into the mix a child with allergies in a country where allergies are not well known and if you didn't already have anxiety you certainly will now.

- When visiting schools let them know about your child's allergy and ask how they keep the children with allergies safe.
- When your child starts school, set up meetings with the subject teachers to ensure they are all aware. Read up on the local culture where teachers may still try and hand out candy randomly to students.
- Vocalize your needs to give yourself peace of mind and ensure your child's safety. For example, I asked for birthday cakes and food to be banned in my child's year level. To have my child feeling excluded and upset every time there was a birthday was too much to handle.
- Send a home lunch! While our school's cafeteria is nut-free and has tried to be very accommodating to our situation, the fact that my child also has other allergies made it unrealistic to expect them to cater. And knowing what my child is eating when I am not around helps me relax also!
- Be prepared to advocate for your child's safety on an ongoing basis. Even if an agreement was reached with the school in a previous semester, don't assume that this will be continued in the next semester or with a change of teacher and staff.
- Encourage the school to see the value in giving non-food rewards to the children such as stickers, small toys, erasers, or house points. It is not only safer but also better for their health candy and cookies are full of sugar!

Bringing a child to Beijing with allergies is doable! It is hard but doable. I went so far as to introduce an allergy education program into my daughter's school – thankfully they were receptive to it! While there may still be a certain level of ambivalence towards allergies, awareness is definitely increasing.



Why Postfolios Matter

Plus when and how to start creating one

Test prep, test prep, test prep. It's been drilled into the minds of students and parents since 1935 when Harvard first began requiring SAT scores to be included in its admission package. However, in recent years many schools like George Washington University, Sarah Lawrence, and NYU have become "test-optional" or "test flexible," meaning students are not required to provide their SAT or ACT scores, while

several other universities including UC Berkley and my own alma mater, Catholic University of America, have become "test blind" and won't even consider scores in their application process.

Although Covid largely accelerated the transition with all the Ivy Leagues, including Harvard, suspending test requirements, many professionals believe it signals a much wider trend and could become the new normal.

While many students are breathing a sigh of relief, it has likewise raised questions about what college aspirants should be focusing on as they prepare for the application process. I reached out to several educators in Beijing and asked what we should be preparing our kids for, when we should start, and how we can avoid replacing test anxiety with portfolio panic.

First things first. What is a portfolio?

In academic circles, it's the new buzzword and possibly the most important part of their application next to their grades. That is because every candidate to a top-tier institution has excellent grades. Your transcript will get you considered but your portfolio is what will set you apart. It's simply a collection of a student's work over the years. A way to show universities and employers a more complete picture than a transcript alone ever could. Basically, it's documenting life experiences that build character and demonstrate a holistic individual ready to contribute to society. Jona-



than Mellen, IB Co-ordinator and Career & University Guidance Counselor at Yew Chung International School of Beijing (YCIS Beijing) put it this way, "Universities and future employers are looking for quality people that are willing to make a meaningful contribution in society." As such, a portfolio is a testament to your contributions and lets schools and future employers see where you might be interested in contributing in the future.

Hamilton Gregg, a college advisor at Harrow Beijing (HBJ) and senior consultant at Shang Nancy Friends stressed the importance of so-called soft skills like leadership, adaptability, communication, presentation, problem-solving, and work ethics. Gregg elaborates, "But it is not just talking about those skills, it is understanding what led to the development of those skills. Sports, clubs, charity, service, etc... students doing meaningful work in these areas and learning about themselves and how they contribute by engaging in them." Mellen echoes the sentiment, explaining "Universities look for students who have fantastic interpersonal skills. One way to develop these skills is by initiating projects in the community. This allows students to plan out something that will benefit the community and then collaborate with others on it. Students are encouraged to work on...time management, stress management, and work ethics."

So what makes a great portfolio?

Gregg says it all boils down to a student "Understanding who they are as a person. What makes them tick, what doesn't?" It's a tall order for most kids – I know plenty of adults who still struggle to define who they are – but that's what your childhood is for. Discovering what you are passionate about and what you want to become an expert in.

That means starting early. A balanced childhood that leaves space for trying lots of different

things and always asking your child, what did you like about that? What did you not care for? What did you learn? Then, over time, they'll slowly begin discarding those activities that don't bring them joy or spark curiosity and engagement. By the time they get to high school they should have a handful of activities they are passionate about and devoted to outside the classroom. On top of that, Gregg recommends three specific guidelines:

- "A student should not do any activity because they think it will get them into university. They should be genuinely interested in what they are doing and reflecting on why as well as what have they learned."
- 2 "Quality over Quantity. It is not about how many things a student has engaged in, but the quality of their engagement."
- There is no right activity, nor is there a right amount of things a student should be doing. However, a student should be more than just an in-class student focusing on their academic achievement...Education happens everywhere, all the time. Many times, it is not in the classroom, but on the sports field, the adventure trek, the community service project..."

This brings us to community service. Many high schools require it nowadays and it is a learning opportunity. But the debate rages over whether mandating good works nullifies the benefits. Mellen weighs in: "I think community

service is just as important as good grades. It shows you are committed to investing in the community, making a meaningful contribution, and developing as a global citizen. ...[But] the focus should not be on hours but meaningful, quality time spent on a project that a student is genuinely passionate about. Authenticity comes from the heart...Counting hours means they must tick a box and character is not a box-ticking exercise."

So let's say your child actually has tons of extracurriculars they are passionate about and they have one service project they are devoted too and they are creative and energetic and kind... but how do you show that?

What should actually go into a portfolio and when should you start compiling it?

A good place to start is by helping your child keep a journal, which they can start doing as early as 8 or 9. Nothing fancy, just regular entries about what they are working on, what they like or don't like, and what their goals are. These can be as simple as "I want to learn how to bend my soccer kick" and "I want to draw a really great butterfly," or as idealistic as launching a coat drive or clean-up project. But they should absolutely be things your child loves and wants to pursue, not what you think will look good on paper. That's because this is not ever going to be part of

the actual application. It's just getting your little one used to goal setting, self-reflection, and evaluation.

Mellen suggests beginning to collect documentable items like artwork, social media posts, photos, and the like around age 10. "They should be able to show how they have developed and what they have worked to improve over a few years. The students should be selective and include artwork that reflects their experience, creativity, things that interest them, their personal style and technical ability." You probably won't use everything you save but having options will relieve a lot of stress down the road and allow your child to tailor the portfolio to the schools they are most interested in.

If this feels like a long process, that's because it is. But it doesn't need to be a stressful one. Remember, you are not creating portfolio content. You're just helping your child actively and thoughtfully document the things they are already doing that make them unique and special. So don't force them into debate, or cello or fencing because you heard a particular Ivy League school gives preference...they don't by the way.

Gregg reinforced that idea. "One thing that is important is that there is no formula for getting into university...Students need to understand they are unique individuals and

honor and respect their uniqueness. Life is not about a test, or getting into university, it is about learning life-long skills, that will help students manage and cope. My point is, don't be a sheep following what others are doing. Break out and be yourself and then truly know who you are and what got you to that point of understanding."

Over and over again the theme was passion, quality over quantity, and the ability to reflect and learn from failures as well as successes. It sounds an awful lot to me like what colleges are looking for are healthy, happy, unique young adults who are eager to learn and contribute to society.

My takeaway? In the early years, expose them to soccer and debate and music and art and design and science and any other opportunity that presents itself and seems even remotely interesting to your child. Let them try and potentially fail. If they do, brush them off and help them learn from it, and then cheer wildly for them when they succeed. See what lights them up and help them focus on that. Let's not replace testing pressure with portfolio anxiety. Instead of pushing our kids to "get it right", let's help them discover what's right for them. The admissions portfolio will then take care of itself, just make sure to snap a few pictures and write a couple of journal entries along the way.



Are Large Schools

Always Better?

Does the size of the school offer different educational experiences for students?

When parents talk about the modern campus, and especially those found at international schools here in Beijing, they often say something to the effect of: "It's huge. They've got everything! I wish I had that when I was growing up." And while providing a child with access to the latest smart classroom and an advanced robotics lab might be considered every parent's dream, does it really mean that one school is better than another simply because they've got more stuff?

No parent, nor any education researcher, is going to dispute the fact that smaller classrooms mean more individual attention and that teachers are better able to adapt to the learning styles of each student, but what about the school's student body as a whole?

In Beijing, a school like Western Academy of Beijing (WAB) has more than 1,300 students while its teacher-to-student ratio is 1:8. Likewise, Dulwich College Beijing (DCB) has more than 1,560 students with a teacher-to-

student ratio of just 1:6. Needless to say, students at these two large international schools are not getting lost amongst the masses.

DCB's facilities include two air-filtered sports domes, a multi-purpose sports hall, six tennis courts, weight room, FIFA twostar-rated football pitch, rugby pitch, cricket pitch, and a swimming pool. The school's campus houses two large theaters with 755 seats combined, two black box theaters, three spacious music rooms, seven practice rooms, two ICT suites including one dedicated to music, a professional green screen film studio, five art rooms, Early Years kitchen and art room, three libraries, 10 well-equipped science laboratories, well-lit classrooms with SmartBoards, and SE21, the state-of-the-art STEAM & entrepreneurship hub. Simply put, it's everything a parent wishes they had while growing up. The environment fosters creativity, innovation, and has the resources to help children explore their interests. But what if its curriculum is at odds with your student's learning style? Then will all those amenities ultimately serve their purpose? They've got small class sizes which means individualized attention all while being offered the resources of a large state-of-the-art international school. It's essentially the best of both worlds.

Meanwhile, DCB also boasts their Worldwise Academy (WWA), a collaborative initiative that brings together students, staff, and parents. It's a program that offers students opportunities to explore their passions in relation to their future studies and professional endeavors. With a large dynamic group of DCB parents willing to share their professional experience, WWA exposes students to a variety of career fields which helps them explore new ideas, gain insights into potential paths, and ultimately, find their own inspiration.

Conversely, however, sending your child to a small school that doesn't have all the bells and whistles doesn't mean they're getting any less of an education. At barely 100 students, AISB-Hope International is one of the smallest K-12 international schools in Beijing.

According to AISB-Hope International, "In a small school setting, each student gets more attention from the teachers. With classroom sizes that are generally much smaller than large international schools, teachers and students can form close relationships that help students to learn, grow, and thrive. Students at smaller international schools also form lasting relationships with each other. There are more opportunities such as student councils, clubs, sports, and competitions, for each student to participate. A student in a small school gets more attention from teachers and at the same time, is able to participate in more activities the school offer. As a result, the student can use the resources the school has to offer more fully. Finally, a small international school like AISB-Hope International offers the same amenities as a larger school with a nurturing and family atmosphere. It is definitely worth the time to do your research and find 'the right fit' for your child(ren)."

In the past, students from larger international schools have said that obtaining leadership roles on campus is more competitive, but that at the same time, their 1,000+ student international schools were able to provide

them with opportunities and resources that they otherwise would not have access to. They're able to participate in a wider variety of athletic and international academic competitions.

The application interview process is like matchmaking. You're there to see if the school is a right fit for you and your family, but at the same time, they're there to meet you and see if your family would be the right fit for their school community. Do you share a common vision as the school? Do you understand the school's philosophy and curriculum?

Beijing's oldest international school, International School of Beijing (ISB) follows their own set of curriculum that draws from the best aspect of various others. At ISB, students don't get homework in Early Years (Early Years 3, 4, and Kindergarten). For some parents, it makes perfect sense for their young child to focus on play based learning. But for others, the idea of non-traditional learning and not hav-

ing homework isn't something they want for their child. Either is fine, but that's when the school visit and interview plays a large part in the decision.

There is no one-size-fits-all set of criteria



when determining which school is best suited for your child, let alone concrete advantages based on school size. There are pros and cons to both. At the end of the day, it all comes down to what your child and your family prioritize.



A Well-Rounded Leader for a Well-Rounded School

Meet BSB Shunyi's new principal, Jayne Needham By Mina Yan



n a cold winter day, I took a car out to Shunyi to meet with the new principal of the British School of Beijing, Shunyi (BSB Shunyi), Jayne Needham. Her passion for education, experience as an educator and leader, and sheer charm were like a ray of sunshine and a breath of fresh air.

Every international school in Beijing's marketing department beautifully presents their school in brochures for parents. But it's only when you really get to know the students, facilities, teachers, and people leading the school that you get a true feel for what your children will experience on a day-to-day basis.

This isn't Jayne's first time in Beijing. Back when her daughter was in a university exchange program, the family had the opportunity to live in a hutong apartment near Houhai for a few weeks, exploring the city, the culture, and its people. And clearly, she fell in love because when the chance arose, joined BSB Shunyi as their new principal.

Having worked at international schools in the UK and Dubai, Jayne attests to just how important the school community actually is. If you're not seeing the experience your children get in your classrooms, then you can't possibly know what's the best thing to do with your school." However, Jayne always finds the time to sit down with the students and chat about what really matters, getting to know the kids on a sincere and authentic level.

BSB Shunyi is part of the Nord Anglia Education group and follows an international adapted English National Curriculum for their Early Years, Primary and Secondary students, preparing them to take the IGCSE examinations at the age of 16. Students in Years 12 and 13 then follow the IB Diploma Program.

Meanwhile, in the fields of science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics (STEAM), BSB Shunyi students are able to tackle real-world challenges and develop transferable skills such as flexibility, creativity, and communication through the MIT–Nord Anglia STEAM Program.

Lastly, a well-rounded education isn't merely about what students get out of their time on campus but also how they can become contributing members of society. UNICEF partners with Nord Anglia Education to help students raise awareness of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and to work with their local communities to create solutions for global issues. This aim at bringing SDGs to classrooms around the world through lesson plans, videos, and creative content.



And why is it suddenly all over my kid's school?

f you're the parent of a middle or high school student you've probably heard the term social innovation a lot lately. The concept is simple: What new social practices or designs can help communities live better? They can be tech-savvy like the translation app Facebook launched in 2017 to connect refugees with legal services, or purposely low tech like the paper spinner designed by engineer Manu Prakash, which can be used by doctors in remote areas to separate plasma from the blood for testing without expensive or heavy equipment.

In fact, social enterprise and impact investing now make up such a large portion of the global economy that the Harvard Business Review weighs it as 20 percent of the overall score when listing the 100 top-performing CEOs globally. What's more, according to the World Economic Forum a larger portion of new companies identify their mission as social impact than at any other time since the organization began keeping such data.

So how does this apply to our kids and their schooling? The idea is that they will use the knowledge and educational foundation acquired in the classroom and apply it practically to real-world social issues. This kind of practical learning is an offshoot of project-based programing that encourages students to focus on making an impact in their communities now, as opposed to 20 or 30 years from now. It is becoming an integral part of training empathetic and globally-minded citizen leaders because students can see first-hand how important their influence is.

Beijing schools have been actively embracing this philosophy, particularly in the form of Social Innovation Projects and Trips. To find out more, we spoke with Elizabeth Walker Sobhani, an 11-year Beijing expat, mom of two, and Social Impact Coordinator for Ivy Education Group.



What is a Social Impact/Innovation Project and is it different from a service project?

The concept of doing service is to volunteer and help out to address a need, while expecting nothing in return which is very admirable. As an educational organization, we believe that service is part of social innovation, but the framework is more comprehensive. It begins with understanding our passions, interests and character and developing these strengths, then deeply researching and connecting with a community challenge to learn more, and finally taking meaningful action to make a difference and inspire others by using our skills and strengths.

Why are they important for children?

Children have incredible potential and creativity to be social innovators, and when this is cultivated in childhood or adolescence, it will become a habit for life. In any career or community they live, we hope they will be looking for ways to make a meaningful difference.

Why are they important for communities?

We cannot rely on the government, businesses, or nonprofits to create a better world – research from the British Chamber shows it will take a generation of social innovators, so we all need to play a role, both adults and children.

What makes a great project?

I believe a great social innovation project is one where the student has a true passion and interest in this area so they are intrinsically motivated, where they do primary research to explore the issues deeply by talking to the community members and actively listening and understanding their points of view, and where they co-create solutions with the community – solutions that are sustainable and address the root causes.

What are some ways schools can inspire students to get involved?

It starts by learning about our communities and some of the challenges we are facing. How can we apply the knowledge students are learning in school to the real-world context? It can come alive with guest speakers that work in the field, or by taking students out to interview businesses or residents who live around the school to understand their needs, or perhaps visit the nearby park and test the water quality and create a biodiversity map. We do not want to live in a bubble of textbooks. I believe schools should be integrated into their local communities so all can benefit.

How can parents encourage their children to get involved?

Children are watching their parents on a daily basis, so we should strive to be role models, showing empathy and care to others and connecting with our communities at work, family or in our neighborhoods, always looking to make a positive contribution. Secondly, we can naturally have more meaningful conversations with our children about the environment, about inequalities, or about the things we care for. Thirdly, we can accompany our children, not force them, to be involved. So, we give them the opportunity to come along with us to a school for orphans to read books, or we support and encourage them if they want to do a trash pick-up with friends.

Once the project is over how can students ensure their work will have an ongoing impact?

Maybe your project is over, but if we really care for the cause, then please stay connected with the charity/community to see how they are doing and share and inspire others to get involved too!


Ultimately, social impact isn't about making a difference once. It's about doing something that will have an effect long term and thoughtfully finding ways to create sustainable change. That, in effect, won't just make a world of difference, it will literally make the world different. Isn't that what we all imagine for the next generation?

"Going Above and Beyond"









